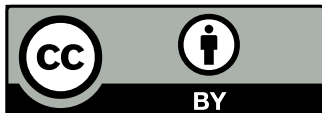



Overview

Introduction

On Saturday, 31 October 2020, the Electoral Commission of Queensland (ECQ) delivered the 2020 State general election of members of Parliament to represent each of Queensland's 93 electorates. The ECQ also simultaneously delivered a by-election to fill a vacancy in the office of a councillor in the Aurukun Shire Council.

The State general election followed the dissolution of the Queensland Parliament and the issue of the writ by His Excellency, the Honourable Paul de Jersey AC, the Governor of Queensland on Tuesday, 6 October 2020. In Queensland, parliamentary elections must be held every four years on the last Saturday in October, in accordance with section 19B of the *Constitution of Queensland 2001*. Voting in these elections was compulsory and was conducted using the full preferential voting system.

The 2020 State general election was delivered amidst the coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic. Under normal circumstances, the preparation and delivery of the election would have been a significant logistical exercise, but the risk of mass disruptions posed by COVID-19 outbreaks added an additional layer of complexity. However, unlike the local government elections held in March 2020, the ECQ had adequate time to plan for numerous scenarios and, if needed, was prepared to alter its service delivery model in parts of the State or across all of Queensland.

Amendments to the *Electoral Act 1992* provided the ECQ greater flexibility in how it could conduct this election and design its service delivery model. While the ECQ planned for and ultimately delivered the 2020 State general election primarily as an attendance ballot, contingency plans and resources were available to change the delivery model to include,

for example, greater use of postal voting or telephone voting if this was necessitated by any emerging public health risks.

No outbreaks of COVID-19 arose in Queensland during the 2020 State general election period, and the health and safety measures implemented by the ECQ and its service delivery partners provided confidence to voters they could cast their ballot safely. Overall, turnout for this election was slightly higher than the previous election in 2017 at 87.92 per cent and the rate of informality declined significantly, down from 4.34 per cent to 3.40 per cent.

This is significant as elections held in many other jurisdictions, particularly those with high rates of COVID-19 infections, experienced declines in voter participation. Additionally, the nomination of 597 candidates and the participation of 12 registered political parties in the election suggests a robust democracy with strong engagement in the electoral process.

A range of new funding, disclosure and compliance requirements for electoral participants, such as candidates, registered political parties and third parties, were also implemented for this election. The new requirements included the implementation of expenditure caps and restrictions on the number of signs displayed at polling places. The ECQ supported electoral participants with information and advice on how to comply with these new requirements and provided ongoing support throughout the election to assist with any queries.

Additionally, the ECQ expanded its compliance capabilities, with a dedicated team of officers who monitored the activities of election participants and responded to complaints or information received throughout the election period. The ECQ is continuing its compliance program following the election.

While the context of the 2020 State general election was unique with the pandemic impacting election services, the ECQ will examine how it prepared for and delivered this election and consider improvements that can be applied for future elections. It is possible the pandemic may have long-term impacts on the normal model of election delivery, for example, many electors may continue to vote early, and the ECQ will need to plan and prepare accordingly for future elections.

About the Electoral Commission of Queensland

The ECQ is an independent statutory authority responsible for the impartial conduct of Queensland elections. In performing its functions, the ECQ seeks to uphold the integrity of the State's electoral processes through the delivery of accessible and fair elections that are transparent and open to scrutiny.

The ECQ's main functions include:

- ▶ preparing, planning and delivering elections in an efficient, transparent and accountable manner
- ▶ regulating electoral funding and disclosure requirements and conducting compliance activities, and
- ▶ maintaining equitable representation through periodic reviews of State electoral boundaries by the Queensland Redistribution Commission.

For the conduct of the 2020 State general election, the ECQ delivered services as prescribed by the *Electoral Act*.

Election timetable

The 2020 State general election was the first fixed-term election delivered in Queensland. In accordance with section 19B of the *Constitution of Queensland*, the election was required to be held on the last Saturday in October 2020.

While the date for the dissolution of Parliament and the polling date were stipulated by provisions of the *Constitution of Queensland*, the remainder of the election timetable was prescribed through the writ for the election. Under amendments to the *Electoral Act* passed to facilitate the safe conduct of the 2020 State general election, additional flexibility was provided to change the election timetable to reduce the risks posed to electors by the COVID-19 pandemic.

▶ 14 September 2020 – Postal vote applications opened

Queensland voters were able to apply for a postal vote prior to the issue of the writ for the first time for this election, in accordance with section 392Q of the *Electoral Act*. The earlier opening date provided additional time for applications to be lodged and for the ECQ to manage the increased demand for this service as a result of COVID-19.

▶ 6 October 2020 – Issue of the writ

Under section 19C of the *Constitution of Queensland*, the Governor dissolved the Queensland Legislative Assembly and issued a writ for the election to be held on 31 October 2020. The ECQ was required to conduct the election in accordance with the writ, which set out dates for the:

- ▷ close of the electoral roll
- ▷ close of candidate nominations
- ▷ election day, and
- ▷ the last date by which the ECQ must return the writ.

▶ **10 October 2020 – Electoral roll closed**

Eligible electors were required to update their enrolment details, such as names or addresses, or enrol to vote in the election by Saturday, 10 October 2020. Enrolling by this date ensured an elector's eligibility to vote in this election. Electors who missed this deadline could still update their enrolment details or enrol by Friday, 30 October 2020 but were required to complete a declaration vote.

Under section 84(1)(b) of the *Electoral Act*, the cut-off day for the electoral roll must be between five and seven days from the issue of the writ. However, section 392N(2) of the *Electoral Act* allowed for an earlier day for the close of the electoral roll.

▶ **11 October 2020 – Candidate nominations closed**

Nominations for candidates for each of Queensland's 93 electorates were open from Tuesday, 6 October until 12.00pm Sunday, 11 October 2020, as set out in the writ. Under section 84(1)(c) of the *Electoral Act* the close of candidate nominations must be between eight and 18 days from the issue of the writ. However, section 392N(3) of the *Electoral Act* allowed for an earlier day for the close of nominations.

The closing date for candidate nominations was brought forward to allow additional time for printing and delivery of postal ballots to accommodate the large volume of postal vote applications expected for this election. The postal ballots could not be produced and despatched until candidate nominations closed and the ballot draw was completed.

▶ **11 October 2020 – Ballot paper order draw**

Immediately following the close of candidate nominations, the ECQ conducted random draws in each electorate to determine the order in which candidates' names would appear on the ballot papers. Details of nominated candidates in ballot paper order were published by notices at each Returning Officer's office and on the ECQ website.

▶ **16 October 2020 – Postal vote applications closed**

Electors could submit their application for a postal vote from Monday, 14 September until Friday, 16 October 2020. The amended timeframes for postal vote applications, authorised by section 392Q of the *Electoral Act*, allowed more time for the ECQ to process applications and ensure the timely distribution of postal votes. Applications received after this date could not be accepted.

▶ **19 to 30 October 2020 – Early voting**

The early voting period commenced at 9.00am on Monday, 19 October 2020 and ceased at 6.00pm on Friday, 30 October 2020 in accordance with sections 112 and 392P of the *Electoral Act*. Early voting was available every day during this period, excluding Sunday, 25 October 2020, with expanded hours offered in many polling places to accommodate high demand.

Eligible electors were also able to register and cast a ballot using the electronically assisted voting (telephone voting) service during the early voting period.

▶ **31 October 2020 – Election day**

Election day for an ordinary State general election must be held on the last Saturday in October as required under section 19B of the *Constitution of Queensland*. The opening hours for all polling booths were 8.00am to 6.00pm on election day.

Immediately following the close of the polls, the ECQ undertook an unofficial preliminary count and indicative preference count of all ballot papers on hand. Results of these counts were progressively published on the ECQ website.

▶ **1 November 2020 onwards – Commencement of official count and declaration of results**

After the preliminary counts were completed, the official counts for each electorate commenced under the supervision of the relevant Returning Officer. All ballots were counted, and postal votes included as they were returned and scrutinised.

▶ **10 November 2020 – Cut-off for return of postal votes**

Postal voters had to complete their ballots prior to 6.00pm on Saturday, 31 October 2020 and the postal votes needed to be received by the ECQ by 6.00pm on Tuesday, 10 November 2020 to be scrutinised for inclusion in the official count, in accordance with section 125(2)(d) of the *Electoral Act*. Any postal votes returned after this time were not able to be accepted for counting.

▶ **16 November 2020 – Return of the writ**

On Saturday, 14 November 2020, the ECQ declared the final result in the election. On Monday, 16 November 2020, the writ was returned to the Governor, listing the names of the 93 successful candidates who now constitute the 57th Parliament of Queensland.

The writ set out Wednesday, 9 December 2020 as the due date for the return of the writ, however the ECQ completed the declaration of results in all electoral districts more than three weeks before this date.

▶ **15 February 2021 – Election summary returns due**

Candidates, registered political parties, associated entities and registered third parties were required to submit an election summary return for the election period by Monday, 15 February 2021. Election summary returns must detail the amount of expenditure incurred for the election, with differing requirements for disclosure of gifts, donations and loans depending on the type of participant.

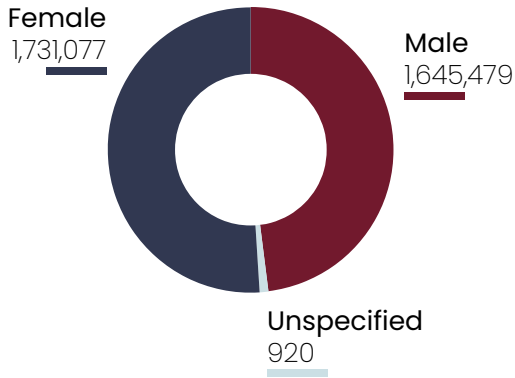
▶ **22 March 2021 – Election funding claims due**

Eligible candidates and registered political parties could apply to the ECQ to receive election funding to reimburse electoral expenditure incurred. Funding is capped based on the number of formal first preference votes received, and claims must be submitted within 20 weeks of election day.

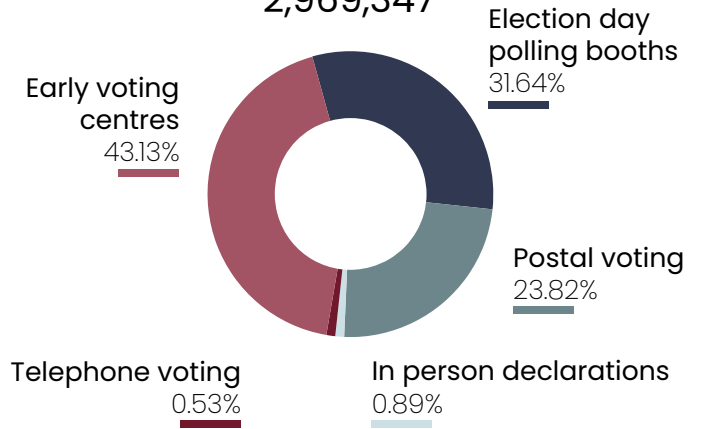

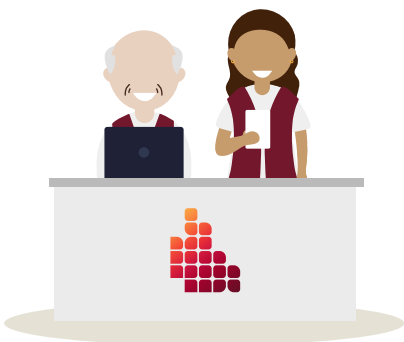

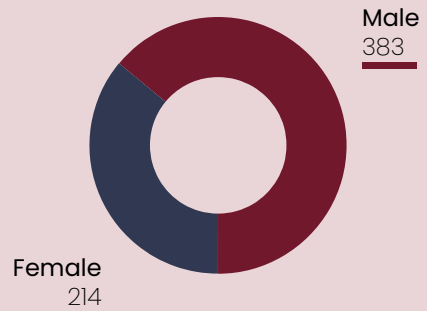

Candidate breakdown

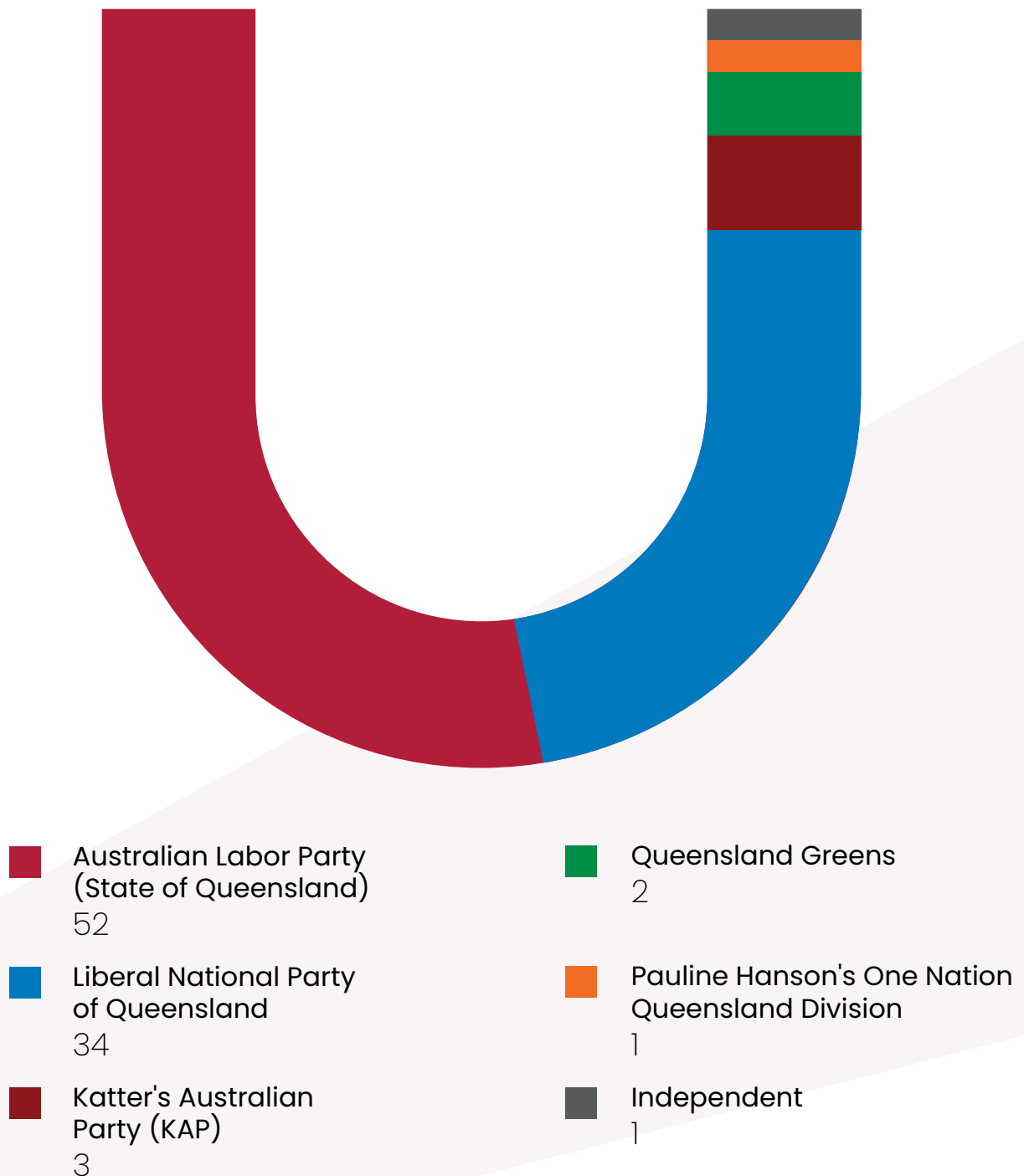


Election results

Results from the 2020 State general election were declared progressively as they became mathematically certain, with all 93 electorates declared by Saturday, 14 November 2020.

On Monday, 16 November 2020, the ECQ returned the writ to the Governor, listing the names of the successful candidates who now constitute the 57th Parliament of Queensland. The 93 electorate districts as represented in the Queensland Legislative Assembly are shown below.

Voter participation

The ECQ's election preparations focused on maximising voter participation by ensuring all eligible Queenslanders had the opportunity to cast their ballot in a COVID-safe environment.

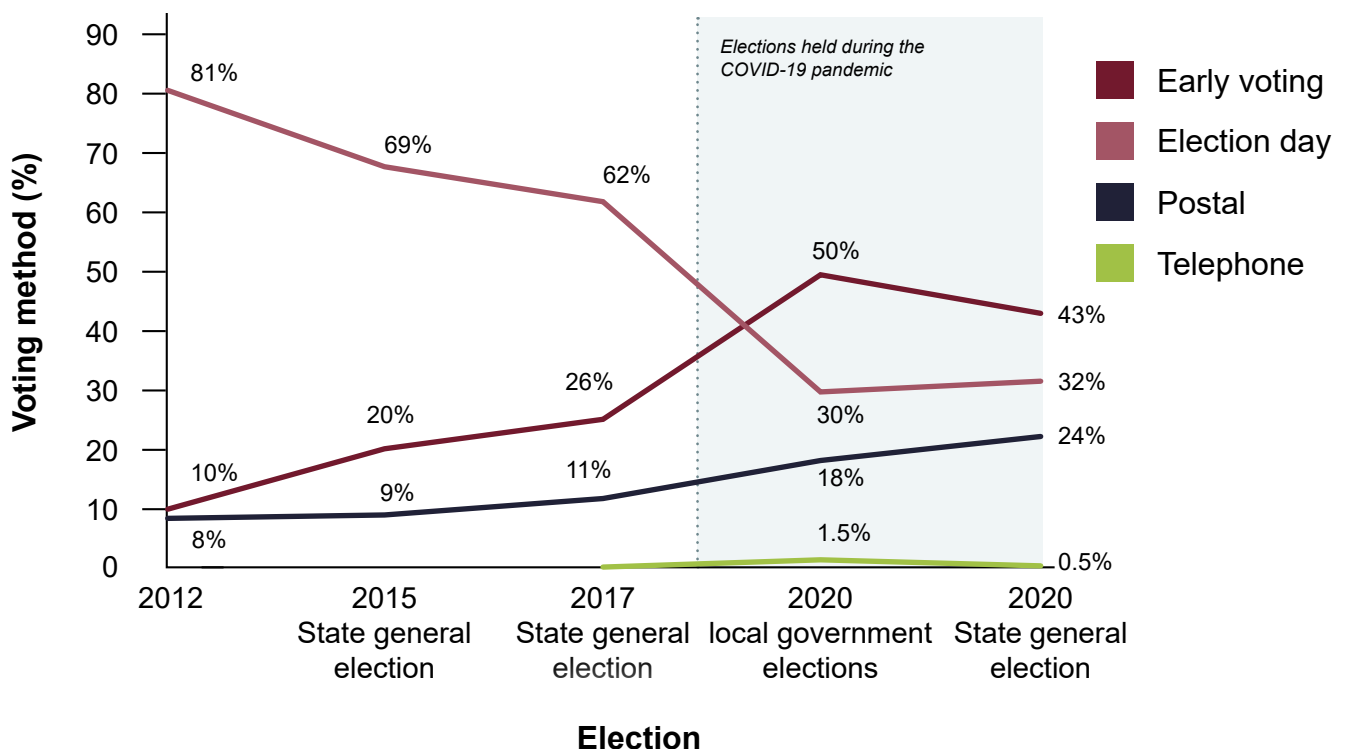
Turnout for this election totalled 87.92 per cent, corresponding to 2.97 million votes cast, which is a slight increase from the 2017 State general election turnout rate of 87.52 per cent.

This suggests the additional COVID-safe measures and services implemented limited the impact of the pandemic on voter participation. Rates of participation varied across Queensland as seen in the heat maps in **Appendix 3**, which display turnout and informality by percentage for all 93 electorates.

In preparing for the 2020 State general election, the ECQ adopted many of the measures successfully implemented for the March 2020 local government elections. With the additional preparation time between March and October, the ECQ was able to increase the availability of early voting centres and expand postal voting service capacity. These efforts reduced crowding on election day and limited the risk of COVID-19 spreading within the community during the election period.

Significant shifts in voter behaviour observed during the 2020 local government elections continued for the 2020 State general election. As presented in the graph below, while declining slightly from the local government elections, voters showed a preference for early voting (43 per cent down from 50 per cent) and increased their use of postal voting (24 per cent up from 18 per cent). The use of election day voting services remained approximately the same from March (32 per cent up slightly from 30 per cent).

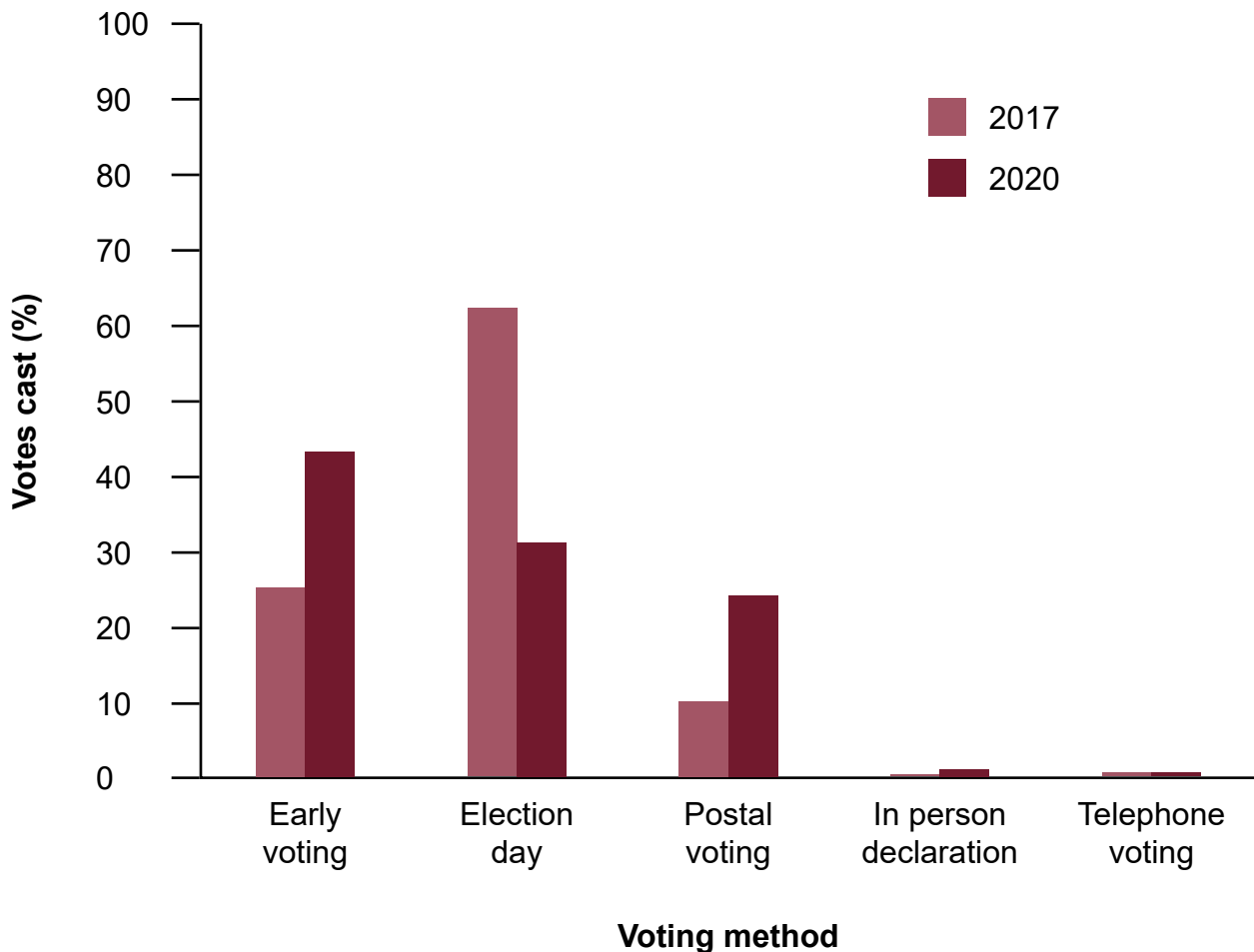
Voting behaviour over time



However, voting behaviour in the 2020 State general election exhibits a significant shift in comparison with the 2017 State general election. The proportion of votes cast at early voting centres and by postal vote increased by 64 per cent and 122 per cent respectively from 2017. By comparison, the proportion of votes cast on election day declined by 49 per cent from 2017.

An important consideration for the ECQ in planning for future elections is whether these trends in voting behaviour will continue at their current rate or return to the trajectory that existed prior to the pandemic. Already, the ECQ observed a long-term increase in demand for early voting services at the expense of election day voting. If these shifts are maintained at their current level, they will have an impact on the planned service delivery model and potentially the cost of election delivery in the future.

COVID-19 Planning

The ECQ delivered the 2020 State general election in the midst of the COVID-19 pandemic. However, the context contrasted significantly with the 2020 local government elections, which commenced on 22 February 2020 when the degree of threat posed by COVID-19 was unknown.

As the local government early voting period began in March 2020, social distancing measures and limits on the size of public gatherings were being introduced, requiring the ECQ to rapidly adapt its service delivery model and implement changing public health measures as recommended by Queensland's Chief Health Officer.

Following the successful implementation of COVID-safe measures at short notice during the local government elections, the ECQ invested significant effort in planning and delivering a range of measures to protect public health and safety during the State general election.

COVID preparations following local government elections

The ECQ had six months between the March local government elections and the October State general election to learn from the successes and challenges of the previous election events, observe the conduct of elections in other Australian jurisdictions, and embed COVID-safe plans as part of its election delivery model.

Due to the ongoing risk posed by the pandemic, and with community transmission occurring across numerous jurisdictions, contingency plans were put in place in the event of a COVID-19 outbreak in Queensland. This ensured the ECQ could, if the situation necessitated, adapt to deliver a predominantly postal election State-wide or in any identified 'hotspot' electorates.

This flexibility in service delivery was supported by additional resourcing from the Queensland Government and special legislative powers enacted through the *Electoral and Other Legislation (Accountability, Integrity and Other Matters) Amendment Act 2020*, which was passed by the Parliament on 18 June 2020. At this time, the Queensland Government also released a *Statement of principles governing the conduct of the COVID-19 Queensland General Election*, which outlined the Government's commitment to supporting the delivery of a COVID-safe State general election.

On Wednesday, 15 July 2020, the ECQ released a [Statement of Intent](#) outlining the measures necessary to ensure Queenslanders were enfranchised for the election, while also protecting public health and safety. The Statement of Intent established the following guiding principles:

- ▶ implementing public health measures to protect the health and safety of Queensland voters based on the advice of Queensland's Chief Health Officer
- ▶ expanding voting services to ensure electors have a range of voting options
- ▶ planning for a substantial increase in early voting and postal voting
- ▶ implementing contingencies for an expanded or predominantly postal ballot if it was required to maintain public health and safety, based on advice from Queensland's Chief Health Officer, and
- ▶ facilitating political participation through arrangements for the distribution of how-to-vote cards and the scrutineering of vote counting, while maintaining appropriate health protections for ECQ staff, voters, candidates and campaign volunteers.

On Wednesday, 23 September 2020, the ECQ released its [Election Service Plan](#). This reiterated and further clarified the planned delivery of a COVID-safe election, including the operationalisation of legislative provisions and available voting services.

- ▶ the power to issue directions regulating the handing out of election materials or how-to-vote cards near polling places and the activities of scrutineers, and
- ▶ the ability to declare certain classes of voters or electorates to automatically receive a postal vote by regulation.

Planning for a COVID-safe election

With the introduction of fixed four-year terms in Queensland, options to change or delay the date of an election are tightly constrained by legislation, with the *Constitution of Queensland* only providing for an election to be delayed for up to 35 days. This meant that the 2020 State general election had to proceed according to the legislated timeline, whereas other jurisdictions internationally had greater flexibility to delay or reschedule elections due to the pandemic.

To support delivery of a COVID-safe election, the ECQ undertook business continuity and scenario planning to maintain flexibility in its election delivery model. This included developing additional contingency plans in response to potential disruptions prior to or during voting, procuring extra materials, and working closely with key suppliers on agreed service delivery approaches.

The 2020 State general election was conducted over an election period, rather than focusing on an election day, with the ECQ delivering a predominantly attendance event, that featured expanded in-person early voting options and a greatly increased capacity for postal voting and telephone voting.

Election delivery was supported by amendments to the *Electoral Act* providing extra flexibility in the statutory framework for the elections including:

- ▶ flexibility to change dates for election milestones contained in the writ
- ▶ the ability to issue notices that changed timeframes for postal voting applications and expand eligibility for telephone voting

Delivering a COVID-safe election

The ECQ determined the ways in which the additional regulatory flexibility provided through the amended legislation should be operationalised to enhance service delivery. Key changes implemented included the early opening of postal vote applications and the declaration of additional categories of electors eligible to telephone vote. Special arrangements were also instituted to provide postal voting in aged care and rehabilitation facilities, known as 'declared institutions', which would usually receive an in-person mobile polling service. Statutory notices issued under these provisions are included in **Appendix 4**.

As part of its continuity planning, the ECQ established a COVID-19 State general election reference group comprising members of the ECQ's senior management team and representatives from the Department of the Premier and Cabinet, Queensland Health, Queensland Fire and Emergency Services, the Department of Justice and Attorney-General, and the Australian Electoral Commission.

The reference group met fortnightly from mid-September 2020 until mid-November 2020 and its remit was to:

- ▶ advise the ECQ on election practices relevant to health directives and COVID-safe workplace practices, and to recommend improvements in election delivery
- ▶ consider regulatory arrangements required to facilitate the safe conduct of the election

- ▶ contribute to the ECQ's analysis of, and response to, any COVID-19 related business continuity matters
- ▶ provide input to the development of the ECQ's communications aimed to increase public confidence in the election process during COVID-19, and
- ▶ consider any other matter relating to COVID-19 that could impact public confidence or the election process.

To support election delivery, the ECQ undertook significant planning to ensure ECQ staff, key suppliers and advisors were able to consistently respond to COVID-19 related delivery challenges, or to change the service model if required.

A COVID-safe plan was developed and implemented at all polling places in consultation with health authorities. Returning Officers and supervisors were provided with guidance and resources to ensure all Returning Officers' offices and polling places were set up to protect voters and election staff from exposure to COVID-19.

Measures implemented at these locations included:

- ▶ training for election staff in COVID-safe arrangements, including standard procedures for addressing any COVID-related incidents
- ▶ actively maintaining social distancing
- ▶ use of contact tracing registers
- ▶ frequent cleaning
- ▶ provision of personal protective equipment and hand sanitation facilities, and
- ▶ the use of visual aids such as posters to remind staff and voters of COVID-safe procedures.

In the instance of exposure occurring in a Returning Officer's office or polling place, the COVID-safe plan included a range of contingencies designed to limit the impact on election delivery, while ensuring the health and safety of all election participants and the wider Queensland community.

Voting Services

The delivery of an election encompasses a range of services designed to ensure all eligible Queenslanders can enrol to vote, safely cast a formal ballot, and have confidence in the integrity of the electoral process.

Elections are conducted within a clearly defined statutory framework, which guides service delivery and planning. The ECQ had to significantly adapt its service delivery approach to respond to the challenges posed by the COVID-19 pandemic, and utilise the legislative framework for this election to allow greater flexibility and responsiveness in planning and executing election operations.

The ECQ undertook additional business continuity and contingency planning to ensure a variety of COVID-19 scenarios had been planned for, and responses could be deployed if a public health situation arose during the election. This included procuring extra materials and working closely with key suppliers on agreed service delivery approaches.

This planning process was guided by two main objectives:

- ▶ maximising opportunities for electors to cast their vote through expanded early voting and postal voting services, and
- ▶ maintaining appropriate health measures and protections for all voters, election staff and political participants.

Based on the voting patterns at the March 2020 local government elections during the emergence of the COVID-19 pandemic, the ECQ expected early voting to again be the primary voting channel in the State general election, and for there to be a high level of demand for postal voting. In contrast to the 2020 local government elections when national COVID-19 restrictions began to be implemented during the early voting period, the ECQ was able to embed capacity for these additional services and altered service demand within its planning framework from the outset.

Enrolment

To vote in elections, eligible adults must be enrolled on the Queensland electoral roll. It is especially important for electors to ensure their details are current and correct, particularly their address details, so they are enrolled to vote in the electorate in which they reside. The Australian Electoral Commission, in partnership with the ECQ, maintains the electoral roll in Queensland, however both agencies undertake activities to improve rates of enrolment and ensure roll integrity.

For the 2020 State general election, the electoral rolls closed on Saturday, 10 October 2020, although it was possible for eligible electors to update their details or enrol to vote after this date. However, electors who enrolled after 10 October were required to cast a declaration vote, which would only have been included in the count once the elector's eligibility was verified by the ECQ.

At the close of the electoral roll for the 2020 State general election, there were 3,377,476 enrolled Queensland electors.

Postal voting

Following the March 2020 local government elections and the changing community restrictions for the COVID-19 pandemic during this election, the ECQ considered a range of scenarios for delivering the State general election, including the possibility of conducting a predominantly postal ballot in all or designated parts of Queensland.

In the early planning stages, it was unclear whether the prevailing public health situation in October would require this option to protect public health and safety. The legislative framework for the election allowed for a regulation to declare that stated electoral districts or classes of electors must vote by postal vote allowing the ECQ to respond to declarations of COVID-19 hotspots at short notice.

Although this model was not required, the ECQ planned for postal voting to be in high demand across the community. In accordance with usual practice, all electors were eligible to apply for a postal vote and have their voting materials, including their ballot paper, a declaration envelope and reply-paid envelope, mailed to them. In anticipation of this increased demand, the ECQ significantly expanded its capacity for postal voting, procuring additional stock and implementing new process efficiencies.

Additionally, the ECQ exercised its ability to receive postal vote applications early, commencing on Monday, 14 September 2020. This was the first time postal vote applications could be received prior to the issue of the writ and, in doing so, provided Queensland voters almost five weeks to submit an application. The usual timeframes for the close of the electoral roll and candidate nominations contained in the writ were also adjusted, maximising the time available to print and despatch postal ballots.

A regulation also declared that electors who were registered with the Australian Electoral Commission as general postal voters were to be automatically sent a postal vote without needing to apply. Any other Queensland elector was able to apply for a postal vote online on the ECQ website by completing an application form and returning it to the ECQ, or by contacting the ECQ service centre.

Applications for postal votes closed on Friday, 16 October 2020, ensuring adequate time for processing and the despatch of materials to the voter's designated address after the close of nominations and prior to election day.

The large demand for postal votes anticipated for the 2020 State general election was realised, with over 900,000 postal votes issued. In comparison, there were 370,000 postal votes issued in the 2017 State general election and 570,000 in the 2020 local government elections.

Electors applied for postal votes through multiple channels, with approximately 475,000 applications lodged through the ECQ website, 310,000 paper applications manually processed by ECQ staff, and 80,000 applications received through the ECQ service centre. A further 45,000 were automatically sent to electors registered with the ECQ as a 'special postal voter', or with the Australian Electoral Commission as a general postal voter.

Although the postal vote application period commenced earlier than usual, ballot materials could not be despatched to electors until after the ballot paper order draw and printing of ballot papers, which occurred on Sunday, 11 October 2020. Postal votes were progressively printed and distributed in order of priority so that 'special postal voters', who are often individuals living in the most remote areas of Queensland, were the first to have their postal ballot materials despatched.

The ECQ worked closely with its print suppliers and Australia Post throughout the planning and delivery period of the election, to ensure the record number of postal ballots could be printed and despatched within the short timeframes available. To achieve this, print suppliers deployed capacity across multiple locations in order to print the postal ballots and lodge them with Australia Post for delivery.

Once electors received their postal voting material, they were required to complete their ballot paper before 6.00pm on election day. Due to changes in postal delivery services as a result of COVID-19, the ECQ encouraged all postal voters to complete their postal vote as soon as they received it and mail it back straight away. To be included in the count, postal votes had to be received by the ECQ prior to 6.00pm on Tuesday, 10 November 2020, 10 days following election day.

Postal voting model

In preparation for the high level of demand for postal voting at this election, the ECQ sought to introduce several improvements and efficiencies in the postal voting process. To assist voters, the ECQ redesigned postal voting materials utilising advice from behavioural economists to improve voters' understanding of how to correctly fill out their ballot paper and declaration envelope.

The ECQ also implemented a new model for receiving postal votes, designed to address challenges with delivery timeframes. In partnership with logistics and print suppliers, postal vote hubs were established in Brisbane and Townsville. The hubs received postal votes from Australia Post distribution centres and then delivered them directly to the relevant Returning Officers. This allowed the ECQ to expedite the processing of postal votes and ensure their rapid and secure transport to Returning Officers for scrutiny and counting.

The two hubs were resourced to process up to 1.2 million postal votes and had the capacity to increase their processing capability if required. For the 2020 State general election, the postal vote hubs processed all 765,000 postal votes returned by the deadline.

Once Returning Officers take custody of completed postal ballots, each declaration envelope is scrutinised based on statutory criteria. The scrutiny process ensures the voter is correctly enrolled, has signed the declaration and had it witnessed by another individual. This process ensures only those entitled to vote can have their postal ballot included in the count.

At the 2020 State general election, approximately 707,000 postal votes were accepted into the count, with approximately 57,000 rejected. This represents an increase in the rate of rejected postal ballots to 7.5 per cent from 3.7 per cent at the 2017 State general election. The higher number of rejected postal ballots compared to previous elections may relate to the increased number of postal votes distributed for this election and the high number of voters using postal voting for the first time. Following the election, the ECQ will evaluate the postal voting process and consider strategies to reduce the number of postal ballots rejected from the count for future elections.

Additionally, not every elector who applied for and was sent a postal ballot ultimately cast a postal vote. While all electors are eligible to apply for a postal vote, this does not preclude voters from choosing to vote in-person, and

around 100,000 electors who had applied for a postal vote exercised their option to vote during the early voting period or on election day.

Early voting

A key aspect of delivering a COVID-safe 2020 State general election was the expansion of services during the two-week early voting period from Monday, 19 October to Friday, 30 October 2020. Voting trends from the 2020 local government elections, where 50 per cent of electors voted during the early voting period, indicated that a majority of electors would again choose to vote prior to election day.

To meet this expected demand, the ECQ established approximately 50 additional venues, with 201 early voting centres operating across Queensland. Consistent with the model successfully adopted for the 2020 local government elections, opening hours at most early voting centres were also extended, with late night voting available on four nights, and an additional day of voting on the Saturday before election day.

The majority of early voting centres operated on the following opening hours:

- ▶ 9.00am to 6.00pm on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays
- ▶ 9.00am to 9.00pm on Tuesdays and Thursdays, and
- ▶ 9.00am to 5.00pm on Saturday, 24 October.

Several matters were taken into consideration when selecting early voting venues, such as their accessibility, security, workplace health and safety considerations, and parking facilities. Wherever possible, suitable venues are used consistently over many elections, including Federal electoral events. In accordance with the *Electoral Act*, the ECQ takes into account the desirability of selecting booths used for Federal electoral purposes. Most Returning Officers' offices were also appointed as early voting centres, in addition to being the administrative and counting base for each State electorate.

The location and operating hours of early voting centres were published on the ECQ website, with interactive map functionality for electors to locate their closest early voting centre. Voters were encouraged to vote outside the peak times to minimise numbers attending polling places at one time, and keep wait-times to a minimum.

All early voting centres were required to operate in accordance with a COVID-safe plan to ensure the health and safety of voters, election staff, candidates and other election participants.

Additionally, the ECQ put in place systems to allow electors to cast an ordinary vote at any early voting centre in Queensland, instead of needing to cast a declaration vote when voting outside of their own electoral district. This was achieved through setting up vote issuing points that had print-on-demand services and could print the ballot paper for any electorate. This helped to move voters through the venues efficiently and reduced queueing at polling places.

More than 43 per cent of the votes for the 2020 State general election were cast during the early voting period, compared to just 26 per cent at the 2017 State general election.

Election day voting

Traditionally, voting on election day has been the primary channel by which electors have chosen to cast their votes. This is reflected in resource and capacity planning, with the majority of polling places in operation for election day only. While the 2020 local government elections accelerated an existing trend of people choosing to vote early rather than on election day, significant capacity remained necessary to accommodate the high concentration of electors voting on election day.

For election day on Saturday, 31 October 2020, voting was available at 1,183 polling booths across Queensland. All polling booths were open between 8.00am and 6.00pm, although some closed early in South East Queensland due to a loss of power caused by inclement weather. The same COVID-safe plans used to set up and manage early voting centres were implemented at all election day polling booths.

As was the case for early voting venues, electors were also able to locate polling booths on the ECQ website. The interactive map functionality, available on mobile and desktop devices, presented the closest polling places near a designated address.

In planning to deliver a COVID-safe election, and considering the voting patterns at the 2020 local government elections, the ECQ expected fewer electors to vote on election day than at previous State elections, thereby reducing the risks associated with large crowds and voting queues. At the 2017 State general election, 62 per cent of the votes were cast on election day, which equates to approximately 1.75 million people attending an election day polling booth.

In comparison, for the 2020 State general election, 32 per cent of the votes were cast on election day, which equates to approximately 939,000 votes. This represents a reduction of around 800,000 election day votes between these events.

The ECQ is conducting a review of polling places used during the 2020 State general election. This will also consider how voting habits may change in the future and the potential transfer of demand to other electoral

services such as postal voting and telephone voting. These deliberations will also consider the impacts of COVID-19 on future elections, the optimal number and locations of polling places required to meet voter needs, particularly

voters with disabilities, and improving alignment with polling venues used by the Australian Electoral Commission for Federal elections.

Brisbane City Hall

Brisbane City Hall was used as an all-district early voting centre and election day polling booth for the 2020 State general election. Electors were able to cast a vote for any electoral district in Queensland as an ordinary vote, rather than needing to complete a declaration vote.

The City Hall voting centre was conveniently located for significant numbers of people across south east Queensland who work in the Brisbane CBD, as well as the growing number of people residing near Brisbane City. As expected, electors using the City Hall voting centre were predominantly from the McConnel and surrounding electorates. However, electors from all 93 electorates, including far north and south west Queensland, voted at City Hall.

There were several improvements implemented for the 2020 State general election based on learnings from previous elections where voting services were provided at City Hall. In planning the operation of the voting centre, COVID-19 factored prominently, with a COVID-safe event checklist created to ensure public health measures were followed, and public messaging about the ECQ's safety measures displayed to ensure the wellbeing of staff and voters. Regular cleaning of surfaces was a high priority, along with social distancing and queue control measures.

A total of 29 temporary election staff were employed at City Hall to issue votes and act as queue controllers during the election. Early voting hours were also extended, with the centre open until 9.00pm for four days, and electors encouraged to vote outside of peak times to help reduce crowds and queuing.

Technology also played a large role in the improvement of services. The laptop devices enabled electors to receive an ordinary vote from any issuing officer and allowed electronic mark-off of voters from the electoral roll. Electors were encouraged to bring their Voter Information Card, either in physical or electronic form. The QR code on the card was scanned to bring up the elector's details, rather than the issuing officer having to manually search for an enrolment record, which reduced the time taken for electors entering the booth to be marked off the electoral roll and receive their ballot paper. These combined factors ensured the daily morning queue would clear in an average of three minutes from opening.

In addition to taking votes, preliminary counts for early voting and election day for all 93 electorates were performed at City Hall on election night, including indicative counts for several electorates where preferences are allocated to the two candidates most likely to receive the highest number of first preference votes. Over 50 count assistants were employed to successfully undertake the count on election night. After election night, votes were packaged and securely transferred to the respective Returning Officers for the electoral district to be included in their official and full preference counts.

Approximately 29,000 votes were taken at City Hall and were counted on election night. This is comparable to the number of votes to most electorates in Queensland, which have an average enrolment of approximately 36,000 electors.

Electronically assisted voting (telephone voting)

Telephone voting is a bespoke and resource-intensive service intended to enfranchise distance voters and vulnerable members of the community who have limited voting options available to them. This includes people who cannot vote without assistance due to an impairment, an insufficient level of literacy, or whose enrolled address is over 20 kilometres from a polling booth. The service was available over the early voting period and on election day.

Electors using this service are required to make two phone calls. Firstly, they must apply to use the service and, if eligible, will receive a registration number and PIN to be used during the second phone call to mark their name off the electoral roll. During the second phone call, an ECQ officer completes the ballot paper as dictated by the voter, with another ECQ officer listening and observing to ensure the vote is recorded as per the elector's direction.

To ensure the secrecy of the ballot, registration for telephone voting and the actual vote taking process are conducted in two separate sites, ensuring the voter's identity remains anonymous to the staff member recording their vote.

The level of demand for telephone voting escalated dramatically at the 2020 local government elections and Bundamba and Currumbin by-elections, where approximately 37,000 telephone votes were cast. This represented a 7,771 per cent increase from the 500 votes that were cast at the 2016 local government elections, and necessitated a rapid expansion of service capacity during the early voting period.

For the 2020 State general election, the ECQ planned for similar or increased demand to the 2020 local government elections, and significantly expanded capacity to ensure all eligible electors could access the service. The ECQ designed an ICT solution capable of supporting a 120-issuing point call centre that was established specifically for the election.

In accordance with the legislative framework for the election, the ECQ designated additional categories of eligible voters to offset the impacts of COVID-19 restrictions on movement and border closures. The ECQ issued a notice declaring that anyone diagnosed with COVID-19, those subject to a quarantine order, or electors who were located interstate or overseas during the election, were eligible to vote by telephone. In addition, during the final days of the early voting period, electors who were self-isolating while awaiting the results of a COVID-19 test were, also declared eligible to vote by telephone. Relevant statutory notices are included in **Appendix 4**.

The ECQ encouraged voters who were ineligible for telephone voting to use an alternative voting option, such as the expanded early voting and postal voting services. This was intended to ensure those electors who rely on telephone voting as their only voting channel were able to access the service, and address issues experienced during the 2020 local government elections where large numbers of ineligible voters sought to vote by telephone. Due to the cooperation of the community, and clear COVID-safe service planning, the ECQ was able to provide an efficient telephone voting service for eligible electors who required it.

During this election, almost 16,000 votes were cast by telephone, a 1,110 per cent increase, as a proportion of votes cast, compared to the 1,200 telephone votes in the 2017 State general election. While a substantial increase between State elections, when compared to the approximately 37,000 telephone votes cast for the March elections this represents a significant decrease and more sustainable level of demand.

Accessibility services

Many Queenslanders face barriers in accessibility when voting. As well as telephone voting, the ECQ offers a range of voter services to ensure Queensland voters have equitable opportunities to have their say at elections and participate in public life as enshrined by the *Human Rights Act 2019*.

Disability access is a key consideration in the selection of polling places and their locations. Accessibility information for the 2020 State general election was published on the ECQ website with details of polling place locations. In addition, there were a number of accessibility services provided.

- ▶ Translation and interpreter services provided by Language Loop were available for people with English as a second language in polling places, and translated information was available on the ECQ website.
- ▶ The Multilingual Guide to Voting was distributed to all polling places to provide voting information in 20 languages other than English.
- ▶ Voters were able to request a person join them should they need help with casting their ballot. This person could act as an interpreter to read and explain the ballot paper instructions, complete the ballot paper according to the voter's instructions, and place the ballot paper in the ballot box.
- ▶ A fact sheet was published outlining the range of voting services available for people with disabilities.
- ▶ Accessible voting services were provided to electors in certain remote communities with services designed in consultation with community stakeholders and tailored to local needs.

In normal circumstances, the ECQ delivers mobile polling to the residents of 'declared institutions', which are predominantly hospitals or aged care facilities, to allow residents and patients at these locations to cast a ballot. Eligible voters can also usually apply for an 'electoral visitor' vote, where an election official attends the voter's residence to enable them to cast a ballot.

As these classes of voter were at significantly higher risk from COVID-19 and in order to protect their health and safety, the ECQ did not deliver these services for the 2020 State general election. Instead, affected electors were directed to contactless voting services such as postal voting. The ECQ also implemented special arrangements to streamline the postal vote application process in certain aged care facilities.

ECQ service centre

In delivering a State-wide election for Queensland's 3.38 million electors, the ECQ delivers a significant customer service program to respond to the needs of the community.

Consistent with the model provided for the 2020 local government elections, the ECQ established a service centre in partnership with Smart Service Queensland. The service centre was the primary channel to respond to phone calls and emails from Queensland electors. Providing this service through Smart Service Queensland, the preferred call centre provider for multiple Queensland Government agencies, allowed service capacity to be scaled-up or down in periods of varying demand.

From Monday, 14 September to Friday, 13 November 2020, the ECQ service centre provided information and support for election participants and responded to enquiries, feedback and complaints. The service centre provided advice and assistance to voters on a range of election matters including:

- ▶ registration for telephone voting
- ▶ contacting electors in quarantine or isolation to inform them of available voting services
- ▶ making calls to provide telephone voting registration numbers for those requiring this service
- ▶ creating postal voting applications
- ▶ providing information about voting services depending on individual circumstances, and
- ▶ receiving general enquiries and complaints.

Based on the level of demand experienced during the March 2020 local government elections, the ECQ expected a high number of postal vote applications would be made through the service centre. Applications for postal votes opened on Monday, 14 September 2020 and there was an initial peak in enquiries to the service centre over the first few days. As a result, service capacity was increased to ensure that voters were receiving the optimum level of service.

A total of 36,000 postal vote applications were submitted through the service centre in the period between Monday, 14 September and Monday, 5 October 2020, the day before the issue of the writ. This reduced the need for those electors to contact the ECQ at other peak times during the election period.

The service centre was open from 8.00am to 5.00pm Monday to Friday (excluding public holidays). Following the issue of the writ, hours were also expanded to include:

- ▶ 9.00am to 4.00pm on Saturdays
- ▶ 8.00am to 7.00pm on Friday, 16 October 2020 to coincide with the close of postal vote applications
- ▶ 8.00am to 6.00pm on Friday, 30 October 2020, and
- ▶ 8.00am to 6.00pm on election day, Saturday, 31 October 2020.

The service centre was also open until 9.00pm on Tuesdays and Thursdays during the two-week early voting period to accommodate those registering for telephone voting, especially to accommodate telephone voters residing overseas.

During its period of operation, the service centre answered 112,801 telephone calls and 18,450 emails. The service centre staff also called 618 electors to provide their telephone voting registration number.

Complaints

Members of the public could contact the ECQ to make complaints about a range of matters, including about elections services and about candidates and parties. During the 2020 State general election, the ECQ received 1,400 complaints. Of these, the primary categories of complaints were:

- ▶ candidate advertising and authorisation (658)
- ▶ postal voting (170)
- ▶ online postal vote application (101)
- ▶ in-person voting experience (81)
- ▶ contact with voters by political parties (69)
- ▶ candidate/party worker behaviour (67), and
- ▶ ECQ staff including Returning Officers, polling place staff and call centre staff (44).

Election Staff

The ECQ is responsible for centrally planning, delivering and overseeing elections through its staffing establishment of approximately 76 full-time equivalent employees. During elections, the ECQ rapidly expands to include thousands of temporary election staff that are dispersed across Queensland.

To deliver the 2020 State general election, the ECQ recruited 10,389 temporary employees, including Returning Officers and other election staff responsible for supervising polling places, issuing ballots, counting votes and performing various other duties across the election period. All staff undertake mandatory training tailored to their role and are provided with resources and support to facilitate consistent work practices across the State.

As the ECQ had already conducted a major election event in March 2020, it was able to leverage its recruitment and training activities from this election, and utilise and build upon an existing pool of skilled and experienced temporary election staff for the 2020 State general election.

ECQ staff

Staff located in the ECQ's Brisbane head office and logistics facility (warehouse) are responsible for planning, preparing and overseeing the delivery of Queensland elections. This includes:

- ▶ identifying and securing venues for polling places and Returning Officers' offices
- ▶ recruiting, training and paying temporary election staff
- ▶ preparing and providing training, education and system support to candidates and political parties
- ▶ increasing elector awareness of enrolment, voting options and general election information
- ▶ overseeing the candidate nomination process
- ▶ ensuring compliance with funding and disclosure requirements
- ▶ ensuring adequate resourcing of Returning Officers' offices and polling places
- ▶ acquiring, configuring, testing and deploying technology to deliver the election
- ▶ procuring, packing and deploying election materials such as voting screens, hand sanitiser, pencils and other material required at each polling place and Returning Officers' office
- ▶ reviewing and approving how-to-vote cards
- ▶ printing and distributing ballot papers
- ▶ managing budgets and procurement of goods and services
- ▶ planning and delivering postal voting and telephone voting services, and
- ▶ conducting post-event reviews to improve service delivery.

Elections are delivered under a decentralised model, with temporary election staff responsible for delivering electoral services in their electorate. However, the ECQ maintains oversight of election delivery activities and works closely with Returning Officers and other temporary election staff during elections to ensure voters receive consistently high levels of service across the State.

To support its 93 Returning Officers, the ECQ established a central hub of six Contact Officers, all of whom were experienced former Returning Officers, to liaise with and provide advice to Returning Officers throughout the election period.

Recruitment of temporary election staff

At a local level, Returning Officers are employed to manage the election in each of Queensland's 93 electorates, with additional temporary election staff employed to undertake various functions to support election delivery. The Returning Officers for the 2020 State general election were recruited through an expression of interest process from the pool of experienced Returning Officers and Assistant Returning Officers who delivered the 2020 local government elections.

Returning Officers are responsible for:

- ▶ administering their office, early voting centres and election day polling booths in their electorates
- ▶ recruiting and managing election staff for their electorates and distributing election materials to polling places
- ▶ training booth supervisors ahead of the early voting period and election day
- ▶ overseeing and managing the conduct of voting across their electorate, including ensuring the security of ballot papers
- ▶ engaging with candidates and their appointed scrutineers during the election period
- ▶ ensuring the conduct of the election complies with legislative requirements and the ECQ's policies and procedures
- ▶ managing the counting of votes through to the declaration of results, and
- ▶ packing and returning election materials to the ECQ warehouse.

Other temporary election staff roles include polling place supervisors, issuing officers and count assistants. To recruit these staff, the ECQ commenced an expression of interest process in August 2020, which continued until the election was delivered.

A total of 14,790 applications were submitted during this time, with the ECQ actively promoting employment opportunities through numerous channels including targeted social media posts.

Any Queensland elector was eligible to apply for employment through the online expression of interest process. This included answering a series of questions and providing examples of their skills and experience. Returning Officers reviewed applications for their electoral district and selected the most suitable applicant for each position. The ECQ also conducted a declaration of interest process to ensure applicants were suitable to carry out the required role, including compliance with the ECQ's political neutrality policy.

Temporary election staff ensured the efficient administration of election facilities and voting services, including the set up and dismantling of polling places, marking voters off the electoral roll, the issuing of ballot papers, and counting the millions of ballot papers to declare election results.

Election staff were crucial in implementing the ECQ's COVID-safe plans, with the facilities set up to maximise physical distancing and maintain cleaning and hygiene levels. Returning Officers received training on COVID-safe measures as part of their face-to-face training for the State general election and oversaw all staff working within their electorate to ensure compliance with the COVID-safe plan.

The successful delivery of the 2020 State general election relied on the services provided by temporary election staff. A survey conducted by the ECQ found that 91 per cent of Queensland voters who cast their ballot in-person were satisfied with the service provided by election staff at their polling place.

Temporary election staff workforce

For the 2020 State general election, the ECQ employed a total of 10,389 temporary election staff, many working in multiple roles across varying locations.

The key roles available included:

- ▶ Supervisors to oversee staff at each polling place and ensure they complied with ECQ procedures. They had overall responsibility for the conduct of voting at the polling place and were also responsible for setting up and dismantling each polling place and for managing the unofficial vote count on election night.
- ▶ Senior Issuing Officers to assist supervisors and issue declaration and ordinary votes to electors. They also supported the set up and dismantling of polling places.
- ▶ Issuing Officers to issue ordinary votes and undertake the unofficial vote count following the close of polls on election day.
- ▶ Count Assistants to assist with counting votes as well as dismantling polling booths.
- ▶ Election Assistants to undertake general administrative duties and support the operation of Returning Officers' offices.

The 93 Returning Officers were appointed for 10 weeks over the election period. Each Returning Officer was based in an office, which housed all the resources required to deliver the election. The Returning Officer's office was also used as an early voting centre in most electorates. During the six weeks of the 2020 State general election period, the ECQ employed 2,787 election assistants to work a total of 63,663 hours.

During the early voting period, a total of 2,152 staff worked 104,427 hours at early voting centres. This workforce was comprised of 277 supervisors and 1,875 senior issuing officers.

Across the 1,183 polling booths operating on election day, a total of 8,511 staff were employed, working varying hours from between 7.00am and 11.00pm. This workforce was comprised of 1,327 Supervisors, 1,029 Senior Issuing Officers, 4,613 Issuing Officers and 1,542 Count Assistants.

Training of temporary election staff

The 93 Returning Officers engaged to deliver the 2020 State general election undertook a training program that built on their existing knowledge and experience from working at the 2020 local government elections and applied this in a State election context.

Due to the critical nature of their work, all Returning Officers received face-to-face training. The Contact Officers appointed to support the Returning Officers also participated in the same training, which consisted of:

- ▶ attendance at four days of face-to-face training in August and September 2020, with content presented by election experts
- ▶ practical activities to demonstrate the various tasks the Returning Officers would need to perform and use of election systems
- ▶ regular webinars to provide updates and information on emerging issues
- ▶ access to a comprehensive Returning Officer manual, Election Management System user guides, and other online resources including webinars to support them in completing their role, and
- ▶ completion of online learning modules to consolidate their understanding.

All other temporary election staff were also required to complete mandatory training before they were able to work. Staff were required to read role-specific handbooks and complete online learning courses. Supervisors and Senior Issuing Officers were also required to attend a face-to-face training session delivered by their Returning Officer. This session enabled

the Returning Officer to provide a practical demonstration of the key tasks involved in performing these roles and to ask any questions before polling places opened.

Performance reviews

The ECQ introduced a new way of recruiting, training and managing the performance of Returning Officers for the 2020 local government and State general elections, which will inform the standard for future elections. A review of the staffing processes in both election events was conducted in December 2020 to identify which aspects worked successfully, as well as identifying areas of improvement.

Each Returning Officer who worked during the 2020 State general election was required to undergo a performance evaluation. This evaluation involved a self-assessment on their performance as well as peer evaluation undertaken by ECQ staff. Election assistants who worked for the Returning Officer were also offered the opportunity to provide feedback on their observations.

The evaluation covered eight measures:

- ▶ people management
- ▶ resources
- ▶ processes
- ▶ communication
- ▶ integrity
- ▶ timeliness
- ▶ security, and
- ▶ safety.

Evaluators were required to provide comments under each measure where they felt they had either performed well or required improvement. Once all performance feedback had been collated, the ECQ conducted individual conversations with each Returning Officer, discussing their performance and providing feedback on areas for improvement and what was done well.

The results of this review will be used as a guide to improve the way the ECQ recruits suitable and skilled applicants for Returning Officer roles, as well as how to effectively manage these staff during their employment at future elections.

Election Resources and Technology

The delivery of a State election is a significant logistical exercise, particularly in view of the decentralised and diversified nature of election delivery in Queensland. With the significant number of temporary election staff, polling places and Returning Officers' offices, a large program to procure and distribute election materials, ballot papers and equipment, must be implemented.

For the 2020 State general election, this also included the procurement of a range of personal protective equipment to protect the health and safety of electors, staff, candidates and volunteers from risks of COVID-19.

The ECQ implemented a range of technological improvements to support election delivery, including developing a new Election Management System to integrate a range of administrative functions performed by the ECQ and election staff into a single system. Additionally, a range of equipment including laptops were deployed to election staff to facilitate and streamline services provided to voters in polling places.

Logistics and materials

A range of office materials, election equipment and ballot papers are required to support the establishment and operation of polling places. In total, 140 different stock items were distributed from the ECQ warehouse to Returning Officers in locations that were up to 1,800 kilometres away. The packing and distribution of election stock was performed by a team of six staff over approximately four months.

Prior to election day on Saturday, 31 October 2020, the ECQ's central warehouse facility had packed and distributed approximately 650 pallets containing materials to supply all Returning Officers' offices, early voting centres and election day polling booths.

This included:

- ▶ 10,000 voting screens
- ▶ 26,500 pencils, and
- ▶ 7,200 bottles of hand sanitiser.

In addition to supplying hand sanitiser for all polling places and Returning Officers' offices, the ECQ supplied election staff with personal protective equipment, such as face masks and disinfectant sprays, to ensure staff had adequate supplies on hand in the event of a health situation arising during the election.

Ballot papers

Electors were able to vote at any early voting centre or election day polling booth in Queensland regardless of where they were enrolled for the 2020 State general election.

To achieve this level of service for voters, approximately seven million ballot papers were printed and distributed to all 93 electoral districts to ensure adequate stock was available. This included a variety of ballot papers, such as those already printed with candidate names in ballot paper order, and 'all district' packs containing ballot papers for all 93 electorates. All polling booths also had the capacity to print ballot papers on demand and were provided with blank ballot paper stock for this purpose.

The printing and distribution of ballot papers requires significant planning, testing and quality assurance. Following the completion of the ballot paper order draw on Sunday, 11 October 2020, the proofing of ballot papers was completed that same evening to ensure the timely supply of ballot papers across Queensland. Ballot papers were then despatched between Monday, 12 October and Monday, 19 October 2020. During this brief period, it was critical that ballot papers were distributed as efficiently as possible to ensure remote areas receive the materials prior to the commencement of early voting.

Election technology

A significant amount of ICT equipment was deployed to election staff and polling places around the State to enable the delivery of election services and to improve the voting experience.

A team of ECQ staff configured and distributed an 'office in a box' to each of the 93 Returning Officers, which contained all of the technology needed to oversee their district's election including communications equipment, computers, screens, bar code readers, printers and phones.

Approximately 7,000 laptop devices were configured for use in polling places. These devices were used by election staff to electronically find and mark-off voters from the electoral roll and print ballot papers on demand.

Returning Officers were supported through a dedicated ICT service desk that assisted in the deployment and use of these technologies.

- ▶ inputting of results throughout the counting period and the declaration of results as they occurred, and
- ▶ website services supporting online postal vote applications, 'Find your polling booth' functionality and publication of candidate details.

Delivery of the Election Management System was supported by extensive functional, user and security testing by the system supplier, the ECQ, and local and global third party experts. The resulting system reflects contemporary expectations and the needs of all stakeholders in the areas of cyber security, information privacy and general utility.

During delivery of the 2020 State general election, the Election Management System was monitored and supported by the ECQ's staff and an array of specialists in the ECQ's extensive partnering network. This included global experts from the supplier, local and global Microsoft specialists, and Australian security agencies.

Election Management System

During 2020, the ECQ deployed an Election Management System supporting the administrative processes necessary to deliver the elections, replacing several paper-based processes with an integrated system.

For the 2020 State general election, the system delivered functionality for:

- ▶ improved digital voter mark-off with enhanced security
- ▶ polling place management online processes to employ temporary election staff, including online applications, recruitment, training and remuneration dedicated portals for candidates and registered political party representatives for various processes including nominations, disclosure requirements and how-to-vote card approval

Electoral Participants

The ECQ works closely with candidates, registered political parties and third parties, as well as their staff and volunteers, to facilitate the nomination process and support compliance with legislative obligations. The ECQ produces a range of resources for these electoral participants that are available on the ECQ website. These include handbooks, fact sheets and guides to explain endorsement, nomination and disclosure requirements.

For the 2020 State general election, briefings were provided to Queensland's registered political parties and third parties to give an overview of each stage of the election process and support them in meeting their obligations. In view of the COVID-19 environment, the ECQ delivered the briefings through online webinars to facilitate safe participation.

In addition, regular email communications were sent to all candidates and registered political parties throughout the election period to distribute important information or provide updates on emerging issues. This included providing advice on processes such as candidate nominations and the ballot draw, electoral roll products, voting services being provided by the ECQ, funding and disclosure regulations, as well as campaign volunteer and scrutineering requirements.

Political party officials also worked closely with ECQ staff regarding their obligations and the ECQ's expectations to assist in the effective administration of the election.

COVID-19 measures for electoral participants

For the 2020 local government elections, the ECQ imposed some limitations on election activities such as the handing out of how-to-vote cards and scrutineering, in order to protect the health and safety of voters, election staff and electoral participants.

As part of the COVID-safe planning for the 2020 State general election, the ECQ was granted similar powers to issue directions regulating the activities of electoral participants. The ECQ issued two directions consistent with advice from Queensland's Chief Health Officer under the *Public Health Act 2005* that reinforced COVID-safe practices relating to handing out election material and scrutineering.

In issuing these directions, the ECQ aimed to strike a balance between delivering an open and transparent election and protecting public safety. To achieve this, the ECQ consulted with candidates and political parties and sought the advice of health authorities and the COVID-19 State general election reference group.

On Thursday, 15 October 2020, the ECQ released its first direction regarding the distribution or display of how-to-vote cards or other election material under section 392T of the *Electoral Act*. The direction, which is included in **Appendix 4**, required campaign staff and volunteers to:

- ▶ not re-use how-to-vote cards
- ▶ abide by social distancing rules
- ▶ maintain hygiene standards
- ▶ not shake, or attempt to shake, hands with electors
- ▶ not approach people who are coughing or sneezing, and
- ▶ wear a face mask where possible.

Failure to comply with this direction carried a maximum penalty of \$1,334 (10 penalty units).

The second direction, also released on Thursday, 15 October 2020, related to the movement of candidates or scrutineers at polling places under section 392V of the *Electoral Act*.

The direction, which is also included in **Appendix 4**, allowed candidates and scrutineers to continue performing their normal functions, however required candidates and scrutineers to:

- ▶ abide by social distancing rules
- ▶ maintain hygiene standards
- ▶ not shake hands or attempt to shake hands, and
- ▶ recommended the wearing of masks in instances where social distancing was not possible when performing their functions under the *Electoral Act*.

Failure to comply with this direction carried a maximum penalty of \$2,669 (20 penalty units).

During the election, the ECQ noted broad compliance with the requirements and principles established by these directions.

Candidate nominations

At the issue of the writ on Tuesday, 6 October 2020, any eligible person was able to nominate as a candidate for election as a Member of the Queensland Parliament.

All candidates, including those who had already made public their intention to run for election or had been endorsed by a registered political party prior to the issue of the writ, were required to formally nominate to be placed on the ballot paper prior to noon on Sunday, 11 October 2020. The deadline for candidate nominations as contained in the writ was adjusted in accordance with section 392N(3) of the *Electoral Act*, in order to maximise the time available to print and despatch postal votes.

Once nominations closed, a ballot paper order draw was conducted in each electorate at 2.30pm on Sunday, 11 October 2020. The Returning Officer, in the presence of witnesses, drew the names of each of the nominated candidates for that electorate to determine the order in which the candidates' names were to appear on the ballot paper.

In total, 597 candidates nominated for the 2020 State general election, with each electorate having between four and 10 candidates on the ballot paper.

Of these, 528 candidates were endorsed by a registered political party and 69 nominated as independent candidates. This is the highest number of nominations received for a State general election since the ECQ was established in 1992. In the 2017 State general election, 453 candidates nominated to contest the election.

How-to-vote cards

The ECQ is required to review and approve all how-to-vote cards intended for distribution on election day, to ensure that they comply with the *Electoral Act* and do not mislead voters. A how-to-vote card includes any material that seeks to represent a ballot paper by listing the names of candidates standing for election and indicates an order of voting preference, or otherwise directs or encourages the making of a preference vote, other than a first preference.

How-to-vote cards to be distributed on election day were required to be submitted to the ECQ for approval prior to 5.00pm on Friday, 23 October 2020 to ensure compliance with sections 182 and 183 of the *Electoral Act*.

The ECQ approved 830 how-to-vote cards for candidates endorsed by a registered political party and a further 24 for independent candidates.

This included instances where a single how-to-vote card required multiple approvals as it displayed voting instructions for multiple electorates.

In instances where how-to-vote cards were not initially approved by the ECQ, those submitting them were provided the opportunity to make any required amendments and resubmit them for approval. Advice on submitting compliant how-to-vote cards was published on the ECQ website and information regarding the approval process was regularly communicated to candidates and registered political parties.

The ECQ has powers to inspect or confiscate a how-to-vote card if it is reasonably suspected that an unapproved card is being distributed on election day.

Electronic Disclosure System

Candidates, registered political parties, associated entities, third party campaigners and donors were required to submit a return in the Electronic Disclosure System, disclosing details of any loans or donations, including any gifts-in-kind that were given or received during the election period.

The Electronic Disclosure System enables the real-time reporting of gifts and donations, allowing for greater transparency and increased public awareness around political funding and financial activity in Queensland.

Electoral participants are also required to lodge a summary return after the election outlining the electoral expenditure they incurred. The ECQ provides a range of information on the ECQ website to assist electoral participants to understand and comply with these requirements.

As at 31 March 2021, electoral participants had disclosed the following donations during the formal election period from Tuesday, 6 October to Saturday, 31 October 2020:

- ▶ registered political parties – \$4.059 million in donations (from 1,012 returns)
- ▶ candidates – \$814,526 in donations or loans (from 170 returns)
- ▶ registered third parties – \$236,589 in donations (from 62 returns), and
- ▶ donors – \$4.373 million in donations to candidates and registered political parties (from 694 returns).

All electoral participants were required to lodge an election summary return by Monday, 15 February 2021. The requirements for these returns differ depending on the type of participant, however all returns must include the electoral expenditure incurred for the election.

As at 31 March 2021, electoral participants had disclosed the following amounts of electoral expenditure incurred for the election:

- ▶ registered political parties – \$20.414 million
- ▶ candidates – \$8.673 million
- ▶ registered third parties – \$5.756 million, and
- ▶ other third parties – \$8,995.

Election funding claims

Following the election, eligible registered political parties and candidates may seek election funding from the ECQ. Candidates and parties are paid the lesser of:

- ▶ their maximum entitlement (calculated based on the number of first preference votes received), or
- ▶ the actual expenditure on their campaign.

To be eligible, candidates must receive at least six per cent of the formal first preference vote, while registered political parties will become eligible if any of their candidates receive six per cent of the formal first preference vote.

As at 31 March 2021, the ECQ had processed claims from three (out of six) eligible registered political parties (noting that one eligible party does not intend to lodge a claim), and 125 (out of 322) eligible candidates (noting that some eligible candidates do not intend to lodge a claim). The 128 claims processed as at 31 March 2021 have totalled roughly \$9.69 million in approved funding being distributed.

Compliance Services

In addition to delivering electoral services, the ECQ's functions also consist of administering electoral laws and, when necessary, carrying out compliance and enforcement actions. Much of this work focuses on ensuring electoral participants are adhering to their advertising and funding and disclosure obligations.

The ECQ is also responsible for undertaking enforcement action against electors who have failed to vote. These actions promote transparency in the electoral system and incentivises greater electoral participation.

For the 2020 State general election, a range of new funding and disclosure obligations were enacted by the Queensland Parliament requiring a significant implementation program by the ECQ.

Electoral expenditure disclosure and registration requirements

A range of new disclosure and registration requirements came into force for the 2020 State general election following the passage of the *Electoral and Other Legislation (Accountability, Integrity and Other Matters) Amendment Act 2020* by the Queensland Parliament on 18 June 2020.

The ECQ developed new resources and implemented new procedures required to facilitate compliance by electoral participants with these new requirements. Key provisions that commenced on 1 August 2020 and applied for this election included:

- ▶ caps on electoral expenditure of:
 - ▶ \$58,000 for a candidate endorsed by a registered political party
 - ▶ \$92,000 per electorate for a registered political party in support of endorsed candidates
 - ▶ \$87,000 for independent candidates
- ▶ \$87,000 per electorate for a third party organisation, with a Queensland-wide cap of \$1 million
- ▶ a registration process for third party organisations or individuals who spend over \$6,000 campaigning during the election
- ▶ a requirement for all candidates, registered political parties and registered third parties to operate a dedicated State campaign bank account, through which campaign expenditure must be transacted
- ▶ increased record-keeping obligations by all electoral participants
- ▶ amendments to key definitions relating to political donations and electoral expenditure and increased requirements for the disclosure of the original source of a gift and sponsorship arrangements, and
- ▶ changes relating to the number and size of election signs that may be displayed as well as the timing of their placement at early voting centres and election day polling booths.

The ECQ's primary approach to encourage compliance was to provide educational materials and information to ensure all affected stakeholders were well informed and able to comply with the new legislation.

In the lead-up to the 2020 State general election, the ECQ:

- ▶ developed an education program to provide stakeholders with access to fact sheets, handbooks and user guides to help them meet their obligations
- ▶ delivered training to Returning Officers about new signage regulations, and published a handbook to guide election assistants in monitoring and reporting non-compliance during the voting period

- ▶ planned and delivered a series of webinars, videos and presentations for candidates, registered political parties and third parties
- ▶ increased compliance resources to build the ECQ's capacity to provide direct support to all stakeholders and perform compliance activities, and
- ▶ published additional materials on the ECQ website so election participants and interested members of the public were able to obtain detailed information about the legislative changes and access additional support if needed.
- ▶ one matter was unable to be resolved as the author of the election matter was unable to be identified
- ▶ one matter was finalised after the ECQ sought the removal of an anonymous social media page posting election-related matter, and
- ▶ two matters are still open and are being considered as part of a larger investigation into potential non-compliance.

During the early voting period and on election day, the ECQ handled 194 matters relating to the number, placement and size of signs at polling booths. These matters were escalated from Returning Officers or other election staff, or through complaints received by the ECQ.

Election compliance

During the election period, the ECQ's compliance activities were focussed on the proper authorisation of election material and compliance with signage requirements at polling places.

The requirement to properly authorise election material with the name and street address of the author has been in place for many elections. During the 2020 State general election, the ECQ dealt with 33 notifications of potential non-compliance from all types of electoral participants. Of these:

- ▶ nine matters were assessed as not breaching authorisation requirements
- ▶ ten matters were rectified by the electoral participant upon being contacted by the ECQ and no further action was required
- ▶ one matter was unable to be rectified as the breach was only identified after the election, however, the ECQ determined that it was not in the public interest to pursue enforcement action
- ▶ three matters were finalised by way of warning letter as electoral participants had attempted to properly authorise their signs, though authorisation was not significantly clear
- ▶ six matters were finalised by issuing penalty infringement notices, with five notices issued to registered political parties, and one issued to a third party

As well as monitoring activities at an electorate level by election staff, the ECQ undertook field visits where serious and repeated non-compliance was being reported. In one of those instances, non-compliant signs being displayed by a third party were confiscated in accordance with the *Electoral Act*. In another instance, a verbal warning was issued to all candidates at an early voting centre. Two instances of non-compliance remain under investigation at the time of publication.

During the election, the ECQ actively monitored the activities of all electoral participants to ensure adherence to their legislative obligations. This included monitoring disclosures made in the Electronic Disclosure System for potential prohibited or anonymous donations, monitoring major media outlets for activities by third parties not registered with the ECQ, and acting upon information provided through the ECQ's complaints process.

These activities have resulted in identification of one third party who was required to register for the election and required to lodge an election summary return outlining their expenditure for the election, and a number of active investigations into potential non-compliance with a variety of requirements. The ECQ also monitored electoral participants' compliance with its directions for a COVID-safe election and that only approved how-to-vote cards were

being distributed on election day. There were no instances of non-compliance identified relating to these requirements.

Post-election compliance of electoral participants

Following the 2020 State general election, the ECQ will be undertaking a comprehensive compliance program, which will include an audit of disclosure returns and monitoring and review of the activities of all electoral participants to ensure they have met their funding and disclosure obligations.

In 2019 and 2020, the ECQ increased the capacity of its Funding, Disclosure and Compliance division, providing resources to improve and support investigations, and assist in collating intelligence on changes in the professional political environment. To ensure the effective use of these resources, the ECQ adopts a risk-based approach in determining where to invest its efforts.

Depending on the findings of the compliance program, the ECQ may undertake investigations, recover debts to the State where expenditure caps have been exceeded, issue penalty infringement notices, or commence prosecutions.

Voter compliance

Voting is compulsory in Queensland and it is an offence for an elector to fail to cast a vote without a valid and sufficient reason. Following the 2020 State general election, the ECQ commenced a non-voter program to identify and communicate with individuals who appeared to have failed to vote.

Electors who appear not to have voted are given several opportunities to contact the ECQ and provide an explanation.

In some instances, the ECQ may accept a valid and sufficient excuse and take no further action. However, if the elector fails to respond to the ECQ's correspondence, or if the excuse is not deemed to be valid and sufficient, further action may be taken, including issuing a penalty infringement notice. The number of times an elector has failed to vote in previous elections will also be a factor in determining the compliance response.

At the 2020 State general election, approximately 250,000 electors failed to vote without providing a valid and sufficient excuse. The ECQ is delivering a compliance program for apparent non-voters, aimed at reinforcing the need to vote and encouraging future compliance. For this election, the ECQ has announced that:

- ▶ it would not take compliance action against first time non-voters (approximately 132,000 electors) but has recorded failures to vote and will monitor compliance at future elections
- ▶ second time non-voters (approximately 61,000 electors) would receive a warning letter, reminding them that voting is compulsory in Queensland and further non-compliance may result in penalties, and
- ▶ electors who appear to have failed to vote at three or more elections (approximately 57,000 electors) would receive an 'apparent failure to vote' notice and be required to either provide the ECQ with a valid and sufficient excuse for failing to vote, or pay a fine of \$66.50 before the deadline (half of the full penalty); otherwise, the full fine of \$133 will apply.

The ECQ has discretion as to how it structures its response to non-voting offences and, in forming its response following the 2020 State general election, has considered the extraordinary circumstances of this election having been delivered during the COVID-19 pandemic. However, it should be noted that the approach for determining compliance action for non-voting at future elections, including by-elections, could change.

Communications

To ensure eligible Queensland electors are aware of elections and of their right and obligation to vote, the ECQ delivers a range of communication, awareness and engagement activities to key target groups and the broader community.

For the 2020 State general election, the ECQ adapted its planned campaign, which had commenced development in 2019 prior to the emergence of the COVID-19 pandemic, to respond to the changed public health environment. This included retaining capacity to develop additional materials and collateral throughout the election period if changes to the election delivery model were implemented.

In addition, the ECQ expanded its stakeholder engagement activities, to ensure key stakeholders and electoral participants had the information they required to participate in the 2020 State general election.

Election communications and advertising

The ECQ delivered a comprehensive awareness-raising campaign to inform electors of the election, based on the theme *Plan the way you'll have your say*, supported by targeted communications to deliver key messages.

The ECQ anticipated a continued high level of demand for postal voting services following the March 2020 local government elections, and facilitated a pre-election campaign to encourage voters to update their enrolment details and apply early to receive a postal vote.

Communications and advertising messages for the 2020 State general election were adapted to focus on voting in a COVID-19 environment, encouraging electors to plan how to cast their vote in advance of the election.

The key messages included:

- ▶ encouraging electors to enrol to vote, or check their details were correct
- ▶ advising of the early opening of the postal vote application period and how to apply for a postal vote
- ▶ promoting extended early voting options
- ▶ communicating health and safety initiatives to ensure a COVID-safe election, and
- ▶ providing information about how to cast a formal vote.

To ensure key messages reached voters across Queensland, the campaign was delivered through a range of channels including television, radio, print, social media, convenience advertising and digital media. Billboard advertising was also included in well-populated locations to help raise general awareness of the election.

Additional communication materials such as fact sheets were developed to supplement campaign content and inform voters of the range of voting options available to them, the postal voting process and COVID-19 measures.

In addition to its *Plan the way you'll have your say* election advertising campaign, the ECQ collaborated with Griffith University to develop a targeted advertisement to encourage young Queenslanders to enrol and vote. This advertisement was placed on on-demand television such as streaming services.

The ECQ used its social media channels to engage with the community and provide regular election updates and information.

During the election period, more than 400 posts were made across the ECQ's Facebook, Instagram and Twitter, generating nearly 12 million impressions with almost 5,000 messages and comments received.

This represents a substantial reduction in comparison to the March 2020 local government election, when 25,000 messages and comments were received, the overwhelming majority of which related to the COVID-19 pandemic.

The ECQ also maintained an active media presence throughout the election, providing a pre-election briefing to media representatives and political commentators, issuing 56 media releases and election updates, responding to 293 media enquiries and participating in 74 media interviews. There was a reduction in reactive media engagement in comparison to the 2020 local government elections, when approximately 470 media enquiries and interview requests were received.

Voter Information Cards

Voter Information Cards are a direct awareness-raising tool designed to ensure all electors are aware of elections, and facilitate a quicker mark-off process for in-person voting.

For the 2020 State general election, Voter Information Cards were sent to the postal addresses of all enrolled Queensland electors, unless they were enrolled as a postal voter.

The card listed the voter's electorate and featured a QR code that polling officials could scan to identify and then mark voters off the electoral roll and issue their ballot paper. The ECQ also emailed the card to electors who had included an email address on the electoral roll, which is an effective means of direct communication with electors that is not dependent on postal services.

The use of the QR code was an important element of the ECQ's COVID-safe plan for polling places, reducing the amount of time electors needed to spend queuing and waiting to be issued a ballot paper.

The content of the Voter Information Card was redesigned with the advice of behavioural economists to ensure the information was easily understood by electors, and to promote participation through the primary voting channels of early voting, postal voting, or election day voting.

For the 2020 State general election, more than two-thirds of electors who voted in-person used their Voter Information Card.

Multilingual Guide to Voting

The ECQ produces a Multilingual Guide to Voting to assist voters with limited English to participate in elections. The guide provides general information about the voting process, including step-by-step voting instructions in 20 different languages, as well as in simplified English.

The translated languages were selected based on data regarding the most commonly spoken languages at home, levels of English proficiency, languages spoken by newly arrived peoples to Australia, and demand for interpreter services.

The Multilingual Guide to Voting also included an infographic page that was developed to assist people from culturally and linguistically diverse backgrounds to understand the voting process. Using the guide as a template, 1,500 'easy to read' posters were produced in key languages. Posters were distributed to polling places where there is both a higher concentration of these key languages spoken as a first language, coupled with a lower level of English proficiency. The guide was available on the ECQ website and was distributed to all polling places in Queensland.

ECQ website

The ECQ website is a key source of election information for members of the public, the media, and other electoral participants. For the 2020 State general election, the website was the central location for a range of essential election information, including candidate nomination details, polling place locations and opening hours, and election results. Importantly, the ECQ also published numerous statutory notices on its website as required under the *Electoral Act*.

Across the election period, the website had more than six million page views, concentrated on content that was directly relevant to voters in the election.

A suite of fact sheets was developed for the election, to provide information about key election processes. Content was updated throughout the election period and covered topics including:

- ▶ the postal voting application, return and scrutiny process
- ▶ the telephone voting process and eligibility requirements, including processes for interstate and overseas electors
- ▶ voting options
- ▶ voting services for people with disability
- ▶ Voter Information Card information
- ▶ the full preferential voting system
- ▶ the vote counting process, and
- ▶ the display of election results.

The website also provided functionality to enable voters to apply for postal votes online, for candidates to nominate online through a self-service portal, and for voters to use the 'Find your polling booth' functionality to search for their nearest polling place locations and operating hours.

Throughout the early voting period, and into the election count, the ECQ utilised the website to publish daily election updates which highlighted key milestones and daily statistics on voting data. A re-designed election results website also interfaced with the Election Management

System to publish results in a timely and efficient manner, supported by a user guide to assist with navigating the display of results.

Publication of voting data

For the 2020 State general election, the ECQ progressively published a wide range of election and voting data that had previously not been released. In addition to daily election updates, daily figures at an electorate level were published on:

- ▶ in-person voting
- ▶ postal votes issued, returned and accepted at scrutiny
- ▶ telephone voting registrations and votes cast, and
- ▶ the progress of the vote count.

The published data provided a transparent account of the voting services being provided to Queensland electors and the level of usage of these services.

Stakeholder engagement

The ECQ implemented numerous measures to ensure stakeholders were provided with the information they required to participate in the election and understand the various election processes.

Due to COVID-19 placing limitations on face-to-face meetings, the ECQ provided online briefings for registered political parties and third parties, Queensland Government agencies, and media representatives and commentators to promote understanding of the election process. Recordings of these events were also distributed as an additional resource for later reference.

Regular newsletter-style email updates were sent to registered political parties and candidates, to ensure they had up-to-date information regarding key election milestones, emerging issues and compliance requirements. A total of 17 newsletters were sent to registered political parties and candidates during the election period.

Additionally, in the 12 months prior to the State general election, the ECQ engaged with several peak bodies representing groups such as people with disability, Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples, young people, older citizens and people from culturally and linguistically diverse backgrounds.

These groups assisted with disseminating information through community networks and provided opportunities for community representatives to offer feedback and input into the planned election service design and delivery.

The primary focus of many of these organisations was ensuring the immediate health and safety of their clients during a COVID election, however, the ECQ intends to continue this engagement to improve service delivery for key elector groups in future elections.

This statement was followed by the release of the 2020 State General Election Service Plan on Wednesday, 23 September 2020, which provided further details about how the ECQ would deliver a COVID-safe election. The service plan also included general information about key milestones, election services, planned post-election activities as well as providing insights into the full electoral process.

This was the first time the ECQ released a service plan for a State general election and provided detailed planning information and greater certainty for electoral stakeholders in the election services to be provided.

Election Service Plan

While preparing for the 2020 State general election, the ECQ considered a range of election delivery options, including the possibility of adapting its delivery model in response to the COVID-19 pandemic.

On 15 July 2020, the ECQ released a Statement of Intent outlining its intended delivery approach to provide certainty to electors, registered political parties and other stakeholders in the lead-up to the election. This statement set out the measures being implemented by the ECQ to ensure Queenslanders would be able to vote in the election, while protecting public health and safety.

Post-Election Day Activities

Following the close of polling at 6.00pm on election night, a variety of activities commenced including the election count, declaration of results, election reporting and evaluation tasks. While many activities were undertaken in the immediate days and weeks following the election, others occur over a period of months.

Post-election reporting and evaluation activities are a critical source of information and are used to inform innovation and develop improvements for future elections and service delivery.

Counting the votes

Following the close of polls on election night, the ballot boxes in each of the polling places across Queensland were unsealed in the presence of scrutineers, and the unofficial preliminary count commenced according to procedures set out in the *Electoral Act*.

The ECQ implemented a uniform counting strategy for all polling places to ensure the maximum number of votes would be counted on election night.

After polling closed, a preliminary count of first preferences was conducted for all ballot papers cast at an election day polling booth or early voting centre, and any postal votes the ECQ had already scrutinised and accepted.

The election night count did not include many of the absent votes cast in other electorates, or votes that were in transit at that time. The absent votes not counted on election night were packaged by the Returning Officer and securely transported to their relevant district for counting.

An indicative count, where preferences are allocated to the two candidates most likely to receive the highest number of first preferences, was also conducted in many electorates on election night. The indicative count provides an indication of how voters have distributed their preferences and the likely successful candidate. In accordance with the *Electoral Act*, these preliminary results are not official and the ECQ does not declare results based on the outcome of these counts.

Queensland's voting system

State general elections are conducted using the full preferential voting system, meaning all formal ballot papers must show a first preference next to the name of one candidate and must then rank all other candidates in order of preference.

During a full preference count, all first preferences are counted and if no candidate receives more than 50 per cent of the votes, the candidate with the least number of votes is excluded and their second preference vote is distributed to the remaining candidates. This process is also known as a distribution of preferences.

The distribution of preferences does not commence until the Returning Officer is certain that the number of outstanding votes will not affect the order in which candidates will be excluded, often after the deadline for the return of postal votes. Once a candidate receives more than 50 per cent of the votes, they are declared the elected candidate. The outcome must be mathematically certain before a result is able to be officially declared.

From Sunday, 1 November 2020, the official count commenced under the control of the Returning Officers after the conclusion of the preliminary count. Declarations of results for each electorate occurred progressively as the counting was finalised and results in individual electorates became mathematically certain.

The first successful candidates were declared on Tuesday, 3 November 2020 and the final electorate was declared on Saturday, 14 November 2020.

The final two electorates to be declared were Nicklin and Bundaberg, with recounts conducted in both electorates. Both recounts affirmed the original results and were conducted in the presence of scrutineers and experienced ECQ staff to provide additional assurance of the accuracy of the final result.

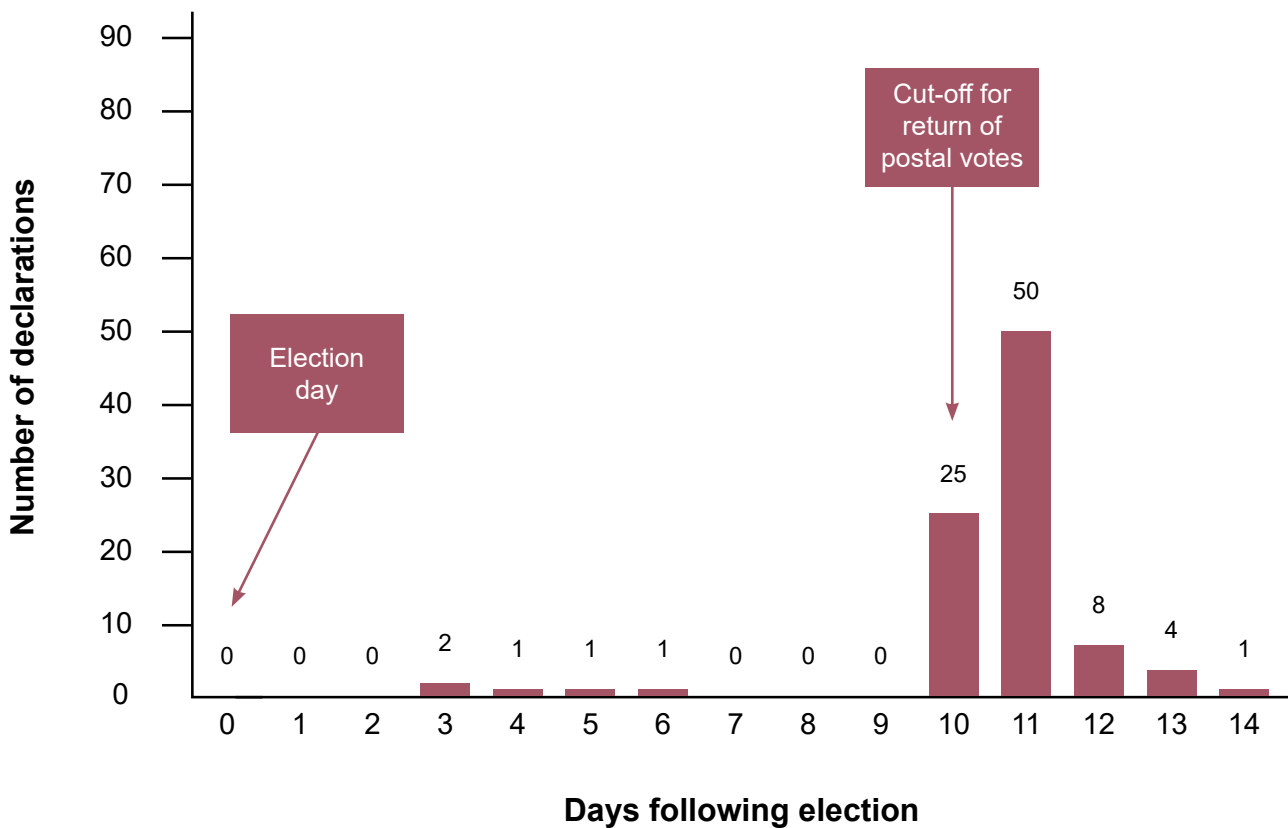
No results were challenged in the Court of Disputed Returns.

As illustrated in the following graph, most declarations in the 2020 State general election did not occur until after the deadline for the return of postal votes on Tuesday, 10 November 2020. For most electorates, where a clear majority was not obtained on first preferences, a distribution of preferences was required before results could be declared.

As the preference distribution process requires the identification of the candidate with the fewest votes, in most cases it was not until after the cut-off for the return of postal votes that the distribution of preferences could commence and the successful candidate could be declared.

Once all electorates were declared, the writ was completed with the names of the successful candidates and the Electoral Commissioner returned it to His Excellency the Governor of Queensland on the morning of Monday, 16 November 2020.

Publication of results

Election results were progressively published on the ECQ results website as count data was entered by election staff and confirmed by Returning Officers and ECQ staff.

For the 2020 State general election, the results website interfaced with the Election Management System, to upload counts occurring in polling places across Queensland.

Prior to the election, the results website underwent a range of technical assurance activities to ensure it could manage peaks in traffic and potential cyber security threats. The ECQ monitored the performance of the website on election night through a dedicated security and network operations centre.

Election event auditing

As part of the assurance activities delivered by the ECQ during the conduct of elections, an audit program was delivered for the 2020 State general election to assess the efficiency, effectiveness and compliance of election services.

The objective of the audit program was to examine how services delivered at polling places met the ECQ's procedural and legislative requirements, both prior to and during the voting period.

A team of 10 election auditors received training prior to undertaking visits to ECQ polling places across 60 electorates. The auditors monitored delivery of a range of different election activities, including the ballot paper order draw on Sunday, 11 October 2020, the conduct of voting over the early voting period and on election day, and counting of votes from Saturday, 31 October to Wednesday, 4 November 2020.

This audit program identifies procedural and compliance issues related to election operations and identifies opportunities to improve future election delivery.

Ballot box seals

During the early voting period, election staff notified the ECQ of a small number of ballot box seals being broken in circumstances inconsistent with the ECQ's required procedures. The procedures require witnesses to be present and seal numbers to be documented by election staff when ballot boxes are sealed and unsealed.

Between Tuesday, 20 October and Monday, 26 October 2020, ballot box seals were inadvertently broken by either election staff, or as a result of ordinary wear and tear in seven locations. All incidents were reported to the ECQ, and instructions were provided to the respective Returning Officers overseeing the elections to reseal and quarantine the impacted ballot boxes.

An internal audit was conducted and witness statements were collected from all persons involved. Election auditors visited the polling places where incidents had occurred and performed observation and inspection activities. This included inspecting ballot paper reconciliations, ballot box seal records, quarantined ballot boxes and replacement ballot boxes to ensure compliance with the ECQ's policies and procedures. All candidates for the relevant electoral district were also informed and advised of the action taken by the ECQ.

The information and statements collected by the ECQ confirmed the ballot boxes remained secure and in the control of election staff at all times. The ECQ determined the integrity and security of the votes had been maintained and all votes were able to be included in the count.

On election night, election auditors (in addition to ordinary scrutineers) were present during the unsealing and count of quarantined ballot boxes in four of the seven locations. This ensured compliance with vote counting and handling instructions provided by the ECQ, including all affected ballots were clearly identified throughout the counting process.

Voter survey

As part of its post-election review activities, the ECQ undertook an elector survey following the finalisation of election results. The survey sought to better understand voter behaviour, gauge public satisfaction, and determine the degree of public awareness of the various election services offered.

The voter survey is an efficient and effective method for the ECQ to improve its understanding of voters' awareness and experiences during the election. The results of the survey contribute to the ECQ's key performance indicators and assist in identifying improvements for future elections.

The ECQ commissioned Kantar Research to undertake the voter survey, which was primarily conducted online with responses from 2,011 voters across Queensland. The sample was supplemented by 400 telephone surveys to capture the views of electors that had limited or no internet access or usage.

The key findings of the survey include:

- ▶ **87 per cent of voters were satisfied with their overall voting experience, increasing from 75 per cent at the 2020 local government elections**
- ▶ 68 per cent of early voters stated 'convenience' and 50 per cent stated 'avoiding the queues on election day' as the main reasons for using early voting services
- ▶ 29 per cent of early voters stated the main reason for using this service was due to concerns about COVID-19, down from 57 per cent at the 2020 local government elections
- ▶ 85 per cent of voters agreed the ECQ delivered the election fairly
- ▶ 27 per cent of voters who cast their ballot at an early voting centre or election day polling booth stated they had to wait in a queue, down from 45 per cent at the 2020 local government elections

- ▶ 68 per cent of those who did have to queue stated the wait time was less than five minutes
- ▶ 84 per cent of voters remembered to bring their Voter Information Card with them when they voted, and
- ▶ 73 per cent of voters recalled communications by the ECQ in the period leading up to the election.

Election evaluation

As part of the ECQ's strategic objective to deliver continual improvement in electoral services, it undertakes formal evaluations of the conduct of major elections to identify areas of development and opportunities for improvement. For the 2020 elections, the ECQ engaged evaluation partners to plan and undertake an evaluation of both the March local government elections and the October State general election.

The evaluation of the 2020 State general election examined the extent to which the ECQ achieved its primary goals of delivering a fair, transparent and accessible election, while also ensuring high levels of voter participation amidst the COVID-19 pandemic. Additionally, the evaluation examined how the ECQ's organisational structures supported or impeded achieving these goals.

The evaluation considered a mixture of quantitative and qualitative information including election data, interviews with internal and external stakeholders and stakeholder survey results.

The key findings of the evaluation showed that despite the ongoing impacts of the COVID-19 pandemic:

- ▶ the ECQ's COVID-safe election planning resulted in a slightly higher voter turnout and lower rate of informal voting compared to previous elections, and
- ▶ the ECQ delivered an election that was fair and transparent with key features including the provision of timely election results, support for candidates and political parties to meet their compliance obligations, and proactive communication with election stakeholders.

The ECQ is examining the findings from the evaluation and will prioritise improvements to deliver the most significant value to voters and other electoral participants. Additionally, the ECQ will use this evaluation to inform an ongoing internal evaluation project that will examine, in greater detail, key aspects of election delivery to identify further improvements in the planning, preparation and delivery of the next major election events due in 2024.

Turnout

Turnout at the 2020 State general election increased slightly from the 2017 State general election. However, analysis of turnout trends indicates that while more people are voting overall, turnout as a percentage of enrolment, has declined over the last decade.

In elections held between 2009 and 2020, turnout has declined by approximately three percentage points. While electoral participation is a complex issue impacted by many variables, there are two factors that may account for much of the recent decline:

- ▶ Australian Electoral Commission initiatives to improve enrolment have increased the number of enrolled electors, and
- ▶ groups with consistently lower turnout across elections remaining disengaged.

Through the Federal Direct Enrolment and Update program, led by the Australian Electoral Commission, enrolment as a proportion of the eligible population has increased substantially over the past 10 years. This program uses data collected from government agencies to add new electors to the roll or update existing electors' details.

Between 30 June 2010 and 31 December 2020, the Australian Electoral Commission estimates the proportion of eligible Queensland adults enrolled increased from 86.1 per cent to 96.3 per cent¹. As a result, increases in enrolment have outpaced the increase in electors voting at elections, leading to modest declines in turnout as a percentage of enrolment.

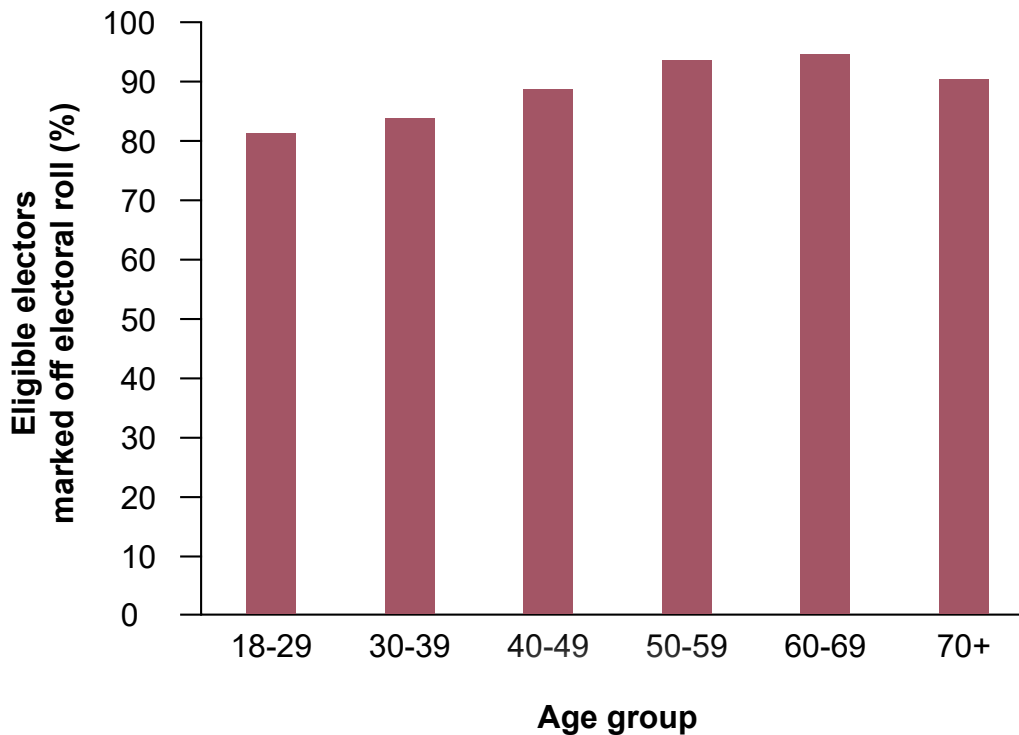
There is also considerable variation in voter turnout between electorates, driven by factors such as socioeconomic status, demographics and geography. The Cook electorate, which encompasses much of Cape York and the Torres Strait Islands, had the lowest turnout in Queensland (79.79 per cent), while the Moggill electorate had the highest (92.45 per cent). This follows the broad pattern of voter participation, with higher turnout in Brisbane and its surrounds, and lower turnout in north and western Queensland and the Gold Coast. These regional variations are likely partially driven by demographic factors that impact on turnout. The heat maps in **Appendix 3** display turnout by percentage for all 93 electorates.

A persistent issue with turnout is youth electoral participation. As shown in the following graph, the proportion of electors who were marked off the electoral roll was lowest among the 18 to 29 age group at 81 per cent. Turnout increases with age, peaking at 94 per cent for the 60 to 69 age group.

These trends, as well as any other demographic factors that may emerge in further analysis, will be considered by the ECQ to design and deliver services that meet the needs of these groups and, by extension, aim to increase turnout across Queensland.

Informality

To cast a formal vote at Queensland State elections, voters must use the full preferential voting system. This means electors must number every box on their ballot paper in order of their preference. In accordance with section 123 of the *Electoral Act*, if 'a ballot paper does not have effect to indicate a vote, it is an informal ballot paper' and it will not contribute towards the election result.

State-wide, the informality rate was 3.40 per cent, which is a significant improvement on the 2017 State general election where the informality rate was 4.34 per cent.

The rate of informal voting in Queensland State elections has fluctuated in recent years. A notable increase of 2.23 percentage points was recorded between the 2015 and 2017 State general elections, when the informality rate increased from 2.11 per cent to 4.34 per cent. This was likely attributable to the change from optional preferential voting being used in 2015,

to the introduction of full preferential voting for the 2017 State general election. Despite this increase, informal voting at State elections has remained below the Federal House of Representatives election informality rate, where full preferential voting is also in use.

There was a further decrease in the rate of informal voting in the 2020 State general election, with the ECQ undertaking advertising and education campaigns to remind electors of the requirement to number every box on their ballot paper for their vote to be counted. The Multilingual Guide to Voting and informational posters were also distributed at polling places to assist electors where English is not their primary language.

The following table shows the rate of informality and the voting system in use for the past three State general elections and Queensland results from Federal House of Representatives elections.

Like turnout, informality varies across Queensland. Analysis suggests informality is higher in electorates that also experience lower turnout, indicating that low turnout and high informality may be linked and have similar causes.

Further analysis suggests an association between turnout and informality. This relationship indicates that turnout and informality may have similar causes: low voter understanding or low voter engagement. This highlights that any intervention aimed at addressing either of these issues should aim to address both at the same time.

Informal ballot paper review

In recognition that informal voting is an important indicator of voters' understanding of, and engagement with the electoral system, the ECQ conducted an analysis of informal ballot papers from the 2020 State general election across 74 electoral districts.

The review sorted informal ballot papers into 'assumed intentional' and 'assumed unintentional' categories to provide insight into informal voting patterns. The results will inform future strategies and programs aimed at increasing the number of formal votes cast at State elections.

Methodology

Across Queensland's 93 State electoral districts, the rate of informality at the 2020 State general election was 3.40 per cent, with informality in individual electorates ranging from 1.30 per cent in the Cooper electorate to 6.14 per cent in the Mermaid Beach electorate. The heat maps in **Appendix 3** display informality by percentage for all 93 electorates.

A targeted sample of 74 electoral districts was selected based on geographical diversity and differing rates of informal voting. For analysis purposes, the selected districts were separated into 'high informality' (4.02 to 6.14 per cent), 'average informality' (3.01 to 4.01 per cent), and 'low informality' (up to 3.00 per cent) categories. The rate of voter turnout was also considered in selecting the electoral districts, with the aim of providing insight into any connection between rates of informal voting and general voter participation. The large sample size and representative composition gives confidence these findings can be applied to all of Queensland.

Informal ballot papers for the selected electoral districts were reviewed and categorised as either 'assumed unintentional informal' or 'assumed intentional informal'. The 'assumed intentional' and 'assumed unintentional' categories were broken into further sub-categories. The definitions of each sub-category as applied during the analysis are listed in the following table.

While it is not possible to definitively ascertain voters' intentions in casting an informal ballot, the analysis seeks to infer the intentions by examining how the ballot paper was completed. This exercise provides important insight into informal voting patterns and will help inform strategies aimed at maintaining low rates of informality and further reducing informal voting at future elections.

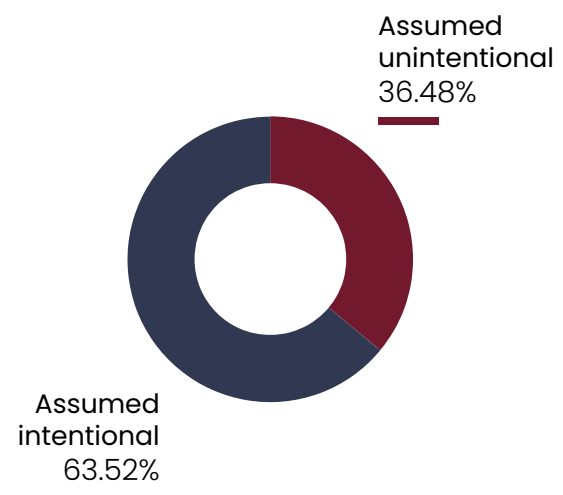
The data suggests that approximately two-thirds of the informal votes cast in the 2020 State general election were intentional (63.52 per cent), while approximately one-third were unintentional (36.48 per cent). Of the 74 electorates reviewed, only four had higher rates of unintentional informal ballot papers, in the Mermaid Beach, Townsville, Cook and McConnel electorates.

Summary of results

Informality can be broadly classified into two categories of causes, relating to whether an elector has intentionally, or unintentionally cast an informal vote. Some informal votes are cast intentionally, as a form of protest or as a show of disinterest, where other electors appear to intend to cast a formal vote but, through a mistake or confusion, unintentionally cast an informal ballot.

The results of the review indicate the majority of informal ballot papers in the 2020 State general election were cast intentionally.

Unintentional informality

The review found the 'optional preferential voting' categories accounted for 24.50 per cent of the total 36.48 per cent of unintentional informal ballots, meaning the voters who cast those ballots did not preference all of the candidates as required in State elections. The use of different voting systems in Queensland may be a relevant factor to rates of informal voting. However, a reduction in the overall State-wide informality rate for this election indicates a normalisation from the peak experienced in the 2017 State general election following the change in the voting system from optional preferential voting to full preferential voting.

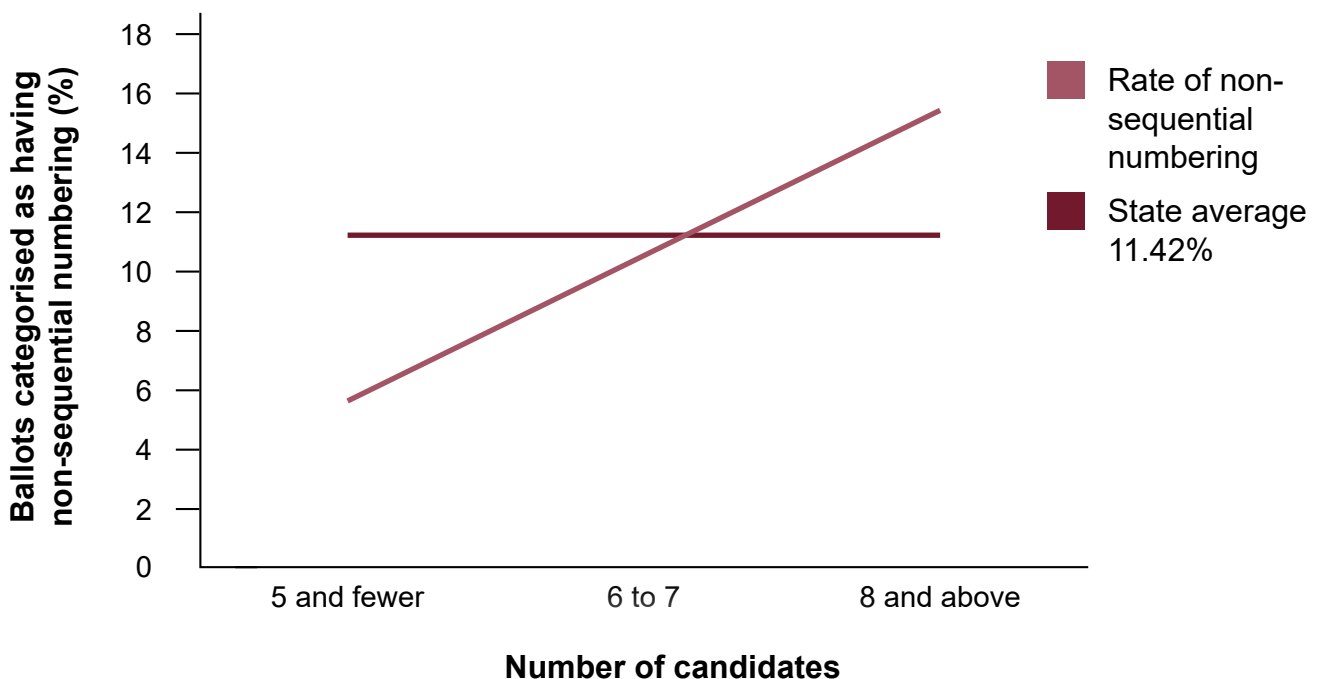
Mistakes with numbering, for example through skipping or repeating preferences, was also a contributing factor to increased unintentional informal voting. Analysis shows the number of candidates contesting an election has an impact on rates of unintentional informality, with electoral districts with higher numbers of candidates typically having a higher rate of informal voting. The 'non-sequential numbering'

category, which accounted for 11.42 per cent out of the 36.48 per cent of unintentional informal ballots, provides a useful indicator of the possible impact candidate numbers can have on informal voting in individual electorates.

The graph below demonstrates that as the number of candidates increases, so too does the rate of informal ballot papers due to numbering errors. This most likely indicates a greater number of candidates can increase the risk of unintentionally misnumbering preferences on a ballot paper. However, it may also indicate a choice by electors who only wish to vote for particular candidates, rather than cast a preference for every candidate on the ballot paper.

While human error will always be a factor impacting on rates of informal voting, there may be opportunities to mitigate unintentional informal voting through additional targeted engagement and educational activities.

Intentional informality

The review found that most intentional informal ballots, close to 45 per cent, fell into the ‘writing, marks, scribbles or drawings’ category, while more than 19 per cent were left blank. These two categories accounted for 63.32 per cent of the total intentional informal ballot papers in the reviewed electorates.

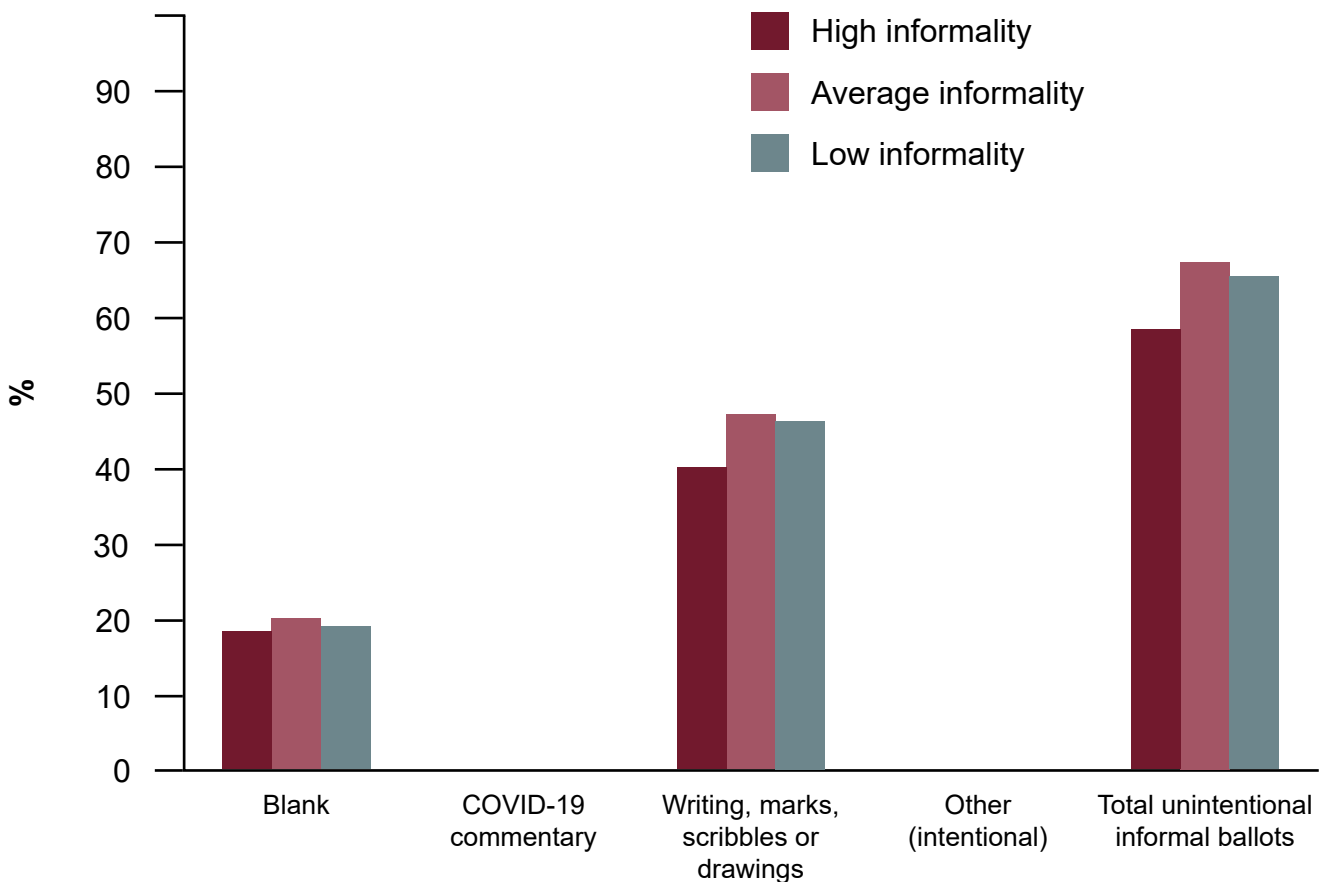
Electoral bodies are limited in their ability to address intentional informal voting, as voters are entitled to cast an informal vote. Nevertheless, the ECQ will use this information to consider opportunities to improve general understanding of formal voting for future elections.

Comparison of intentionality

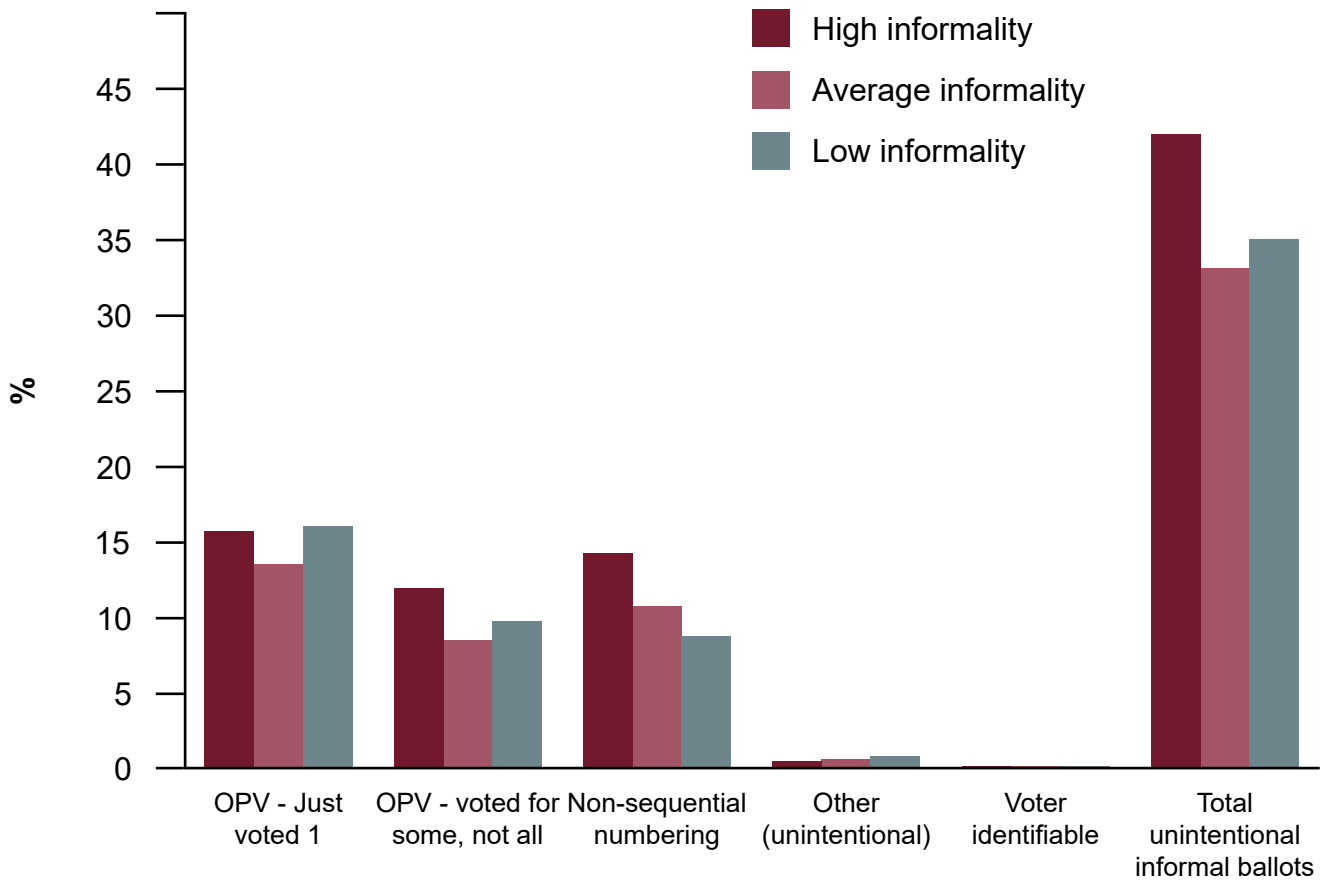
The review found that electorates classified as higher informality had more unintentional informal voting when compared to electorates classified as having low or average informality. As the graphs below suggest, this is driven by higher levels of non-sequential numbering and the use of optional preferential voting, whereby voters did not number all the candidates in order of preference.

There does not appear to be significant difference in the types of informality in electorates classed as either average or low informality, except to note these electorates had a higher rate of intentional informal voting, driven by the number of ballots with writing, marks, scribbles or drawings.

High informality electorates

Of the 74 electoral districts reviewed from the 2020 State general election, the adjacent table lists the 20 electorates which were classified as 'high informality'.

The review and categorisation of informal ballot papers for these electoral districts revealed the following information:

- ▶ The average voter turnout for the high informality electoral districts was 85.36 per cent, which is more than 2.5 percentage points below the State average of 87.92 per cent.
- ▶ Fifteen of the 20 high informality electoral districts were located in south-east Queensland³, with seven in the Gold Coast region⁴. The remaining five were located outside the south-east including the Townsville, Gympie, Rockhampton, Cook and Mulgrave electorates.
- ▶ The combined results from the categorisation process across the 20 electoral districts indicates that a total of 58.16 per cent of informal ballots were intentionally cast. 41.84 per cent were classified as unintentionally informal, which is higher than the Queensland-wide total of 36.48 per cent.

Assumed intentional

- ▶ Seventeen of the electorates had a higher rate of assumed intentional informal ballot papers, with more than 50 per cent of informal ballot papers categorised into assumed intentional categories.
- ▶ Eight of the 17 electorates, Waterford, Gympie, Morayfield, Caloundra, Theodore, Bundamba, Maroochydore and Mulgrave, had a significantly higher rate of intentionally informal ballot papers, with between 60 to 72 per cent categorised into the assumed intentional categories.

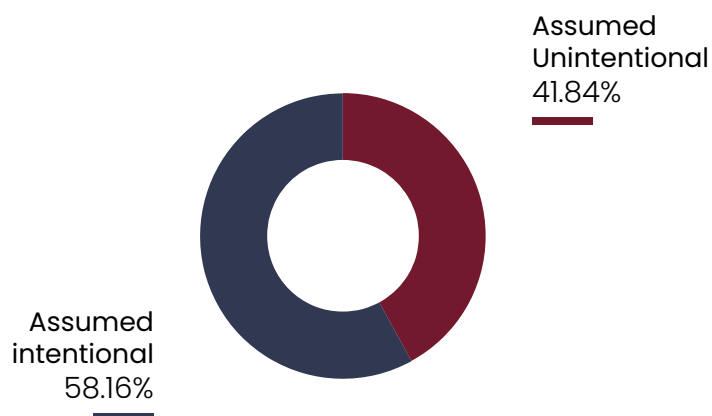

Assumed unintentional

- ▶ Only three of the 20 electorates, Mermaid Beach, Townsville and Cook, had a higher rate of assumed unintentional informal ballots, with more than 50 per cent of their informal ballot papers categorised into the assumed unintentional categories.
- ▶ Voters who cast an informal 'OPV' ballot, by either just voting for one candidate, or voting for some but not all of the candidates, accounted for the majority of assumed unintentional informal ballots in 18 of the 20 electoral districts.
- ▶ Following the combined 'OPV' category total, the 'non-sequential numbering' category accounted for the next most common unintentional informal ballot. In the electorates of Townsville and Gympie, 'non-sequential numbering' accounted for the majority of unintentional informal ballots cast for those electorates.
- ▶ In the 13 electorates where 'non-sequential numbering' accounted for more than 10 per cent of their unintentional informal ballots, there were seven or more candidates contesting these elections.

High informality electorates



Average informality electorates

Of the 74 electoral districts reviewed from the 2020 State general election, the adjacent table lists the 31 electorates which were classified as 'average informality'.

The review and categorisation of informal ballot papers for these electoral districts revealed the following information:

- ▶ The average voter turnout was 87.89 per cent, which is only slightly below the State average of 87.92 per cent.
- ▶ Electorates were evenly dispersed within and outside the south-east corner, with 17 located in south-east Queensland and the remaining 14 located further north or west⁵.
- ▶ The combined results from the categorisation process across the 31 electoral districts found a total of 67.05 per cent of informal ballots were intentionally cast, with 32.95 per cent assumed to be unintentionally informal, which is similar to the Queensland-wide rates.

Assumed intentional

- ▶ All electorates had a higher rate of assumed intentional informal voting than unintentional informal voting, with all 31 electoral districts having more than 50 per cent of their informal ballot papers categorised into assumed intentional categories.
- ▶ Twenty-five of these electorates had a significantly higher rate of intentional informal voting, with between 60 to 81 per cent of each of their informal ballots categorised into the assumed intentional categories. The Ipswich West, Mirani, Logan, Algester, Nicklin, Kurwongbah, Hervey Bay, Murrumba, Lockyer and Bancroft electorates had more than 70 per cent of their informal ballot papers found to be intentionally cast.

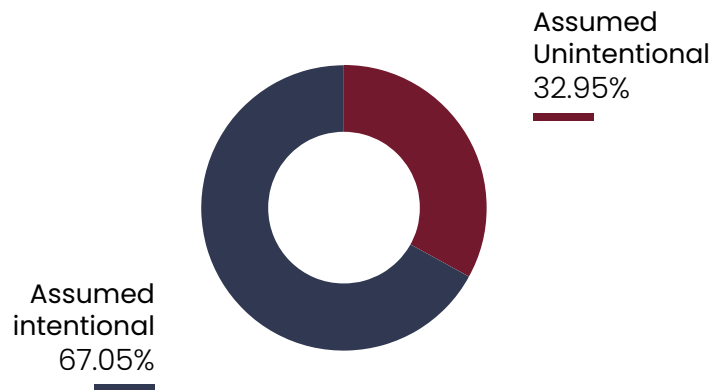
- ▶ Of the assumed intentional informal ballot papers that were categorised for these electorates, most of these votes were categorised into the 'writing, marks, scribbles or drawings' category. The next most common category was 'blank' ballot papers.

Assumed unintentional

- ▶ None of the 31 electorates had a higher rate of assumed unintentional informal voting. Only six electoral districts, Burnett, Maryborough, Bonney, Hill, Burdekin and Pine Rivers, had more than 40 per cent of their informal ballot papers categorised into assumed unintentional categories. The Burdekin electorate at 47.19 per cent, had the highest proportion of unintentional informal voting of the 31 electorates.

- ▶ Voters who cast an informal 'OPV' ballot, by either just voting for one candidate, or voting for some but not all of the candidates, accounted for the majority of assumed unintentional informal ballots in 30 of the 31 electoral districts.
- ▶ Following the combined 'OPV' category total, the 'non-sequential numbering' category accounted for the next most common unintentional informal ballot. In the electorate of Burnett however, 'non-sequential numbering' accounted for most of its unintentional informal ballots at 22.67 per cent, while the combined 'OPV' categories accounted for 17.81 per cent.
- ▶ In the 15 electorates where 'non-sequential numbering' accounted for more than 10 per cent of their unintentional informal ballots, there were six or more candidates contesting these elections.

Average informality electorates



Low informality electorates

Of the 74 electoral districts reviewed from the 2020 State general election, the adjacent table lists the 23 electorates which were classified as 'low informality'.

The review and categorisation of informal ballot papers for these electoral districts revealed the following information:

- ▶ The average voter turnout for these electoral districts was 89.14 per cent, which is more than 1.2 percentage points above the turnout rate of 87.92 per cent for the 2020 State general election.
- ▶ Fourteen⁶ of these electoral districts were in south-east Queensland, with the remaining nine located further north or west including Warrego, Toowoomba North, Toowoomba South, Nanango, Gregory, Condamine, Keppel, Callide and Traeger.
- ▶ The combined results from the categorisation process across the 23 electoral districts found a total of 65.10 per cent of informal ballots were intentionally cast, with 34.90 per cent assumed to be unintentionally informal, which is similar to the Queensland-wide rates.

Assumed intentional

- ▶ Twenty-two of the 23 electorates had a higher rate of assumed intentional informal ballot papers, with more than 50 per cent of their informal ballot papers categorised into assumed intentional categories.
- ▶ Fifteen of these electorates had a significantly higher rate of intentional informal voting, with between 60 to 83 per cent of each of their informal ballots categorised into the assumed intentional categories. The Condamine, Sandgate, Nanango, Noosa and Greenslopes electorates had more than 70 per cent of their informal ballot papers found to be intentionally cast.

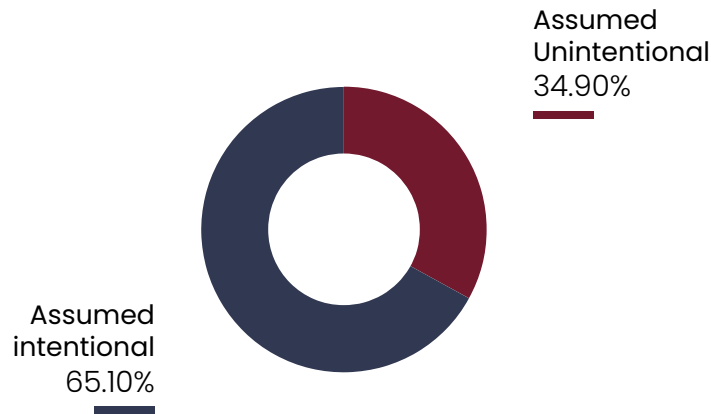

Assumed unintentional

- ▶ The electorate of McConnell was the only district that had a higher rate of unintentional informal ballots, with more than 53.40 per cent categorised into the assumed unintentional categories.
- ▶ Voters who cast an informal 'OPV' ballot, by either just voting for one candidate, or voting for some but not all of the candidates, accounted for the majority of assumed unintentional informal ballots in all 23 electoral districts.
- ▶ Following the combined 'OPV' category total, the 'non-sequential numbering' category accounted for the next most common unintentional informal ballot.
- ▶ In the seven electorates where 'non-sequential numbering' accounted for more than 10 per cent of their unintentional informal ballots, there were six or more candidates contesting these elections.

Future Actions

The year 2020 was an intensive twelve months of election delivery in Queensland, which saw the ECQ conduct local government quadrennial elections for 77 councils, the State general election for 93 electoral districts, two State by-elections and two local government by-elections.

The challenges raised by the COVID-19 global pandemic necessitated a range of innovations and adaptations to the traditional election delivery model ensuring the ECQ was able to conduct elections and maintain continuity of government in Queensland. The resulting changes in election delivery were accompanied by a corresponding shift in voter behaviour that saw early voting numbers exceed election day voting numbers in Queensland for the first time.

It is not yet clear whether this trend will be sustained, or whether these changes were primarily attributable to the impact of the pandemic. Regardless, the experiences of the 2020 elections provide the ECQ with a range of valuable operational and strategic insights that can be used to inform improvements to election delivery into the future.

To ensure that these experiences are captured and applied to future operations, the ECQ is undertaking a comprehensive program of operational evaluations aimed at improving future election delivery. These improvements will be applied on an ongoing basis as the ECQ continues its mandate to deliver local government and State by-elections prior to the next major election events due in 2024.

The ECQ will also develop and implement system and operational processes required to support the forthcoming commencement of a cap on political donations to political parties, candidates and third parties. The legislative amendments to impose this cap have been passed by the Queensland Parliament and are scheduled to commence from 1 July 2022.

Throughout the 2020 election year, the ECQ published more detailed electoral information with the aim of increasing transparency in election delivery. As planning and preparations continue in the lead-up to the 2024 elections, the ECQ will continue to expand the publication of data and electoral information while improving the election delivery model to ensure it meets contemporary expectations of the electorate, political participants and the broader public.

(The number of electors who cast a ballot, as a percentage of the total number of electors enrolled in an electorate)



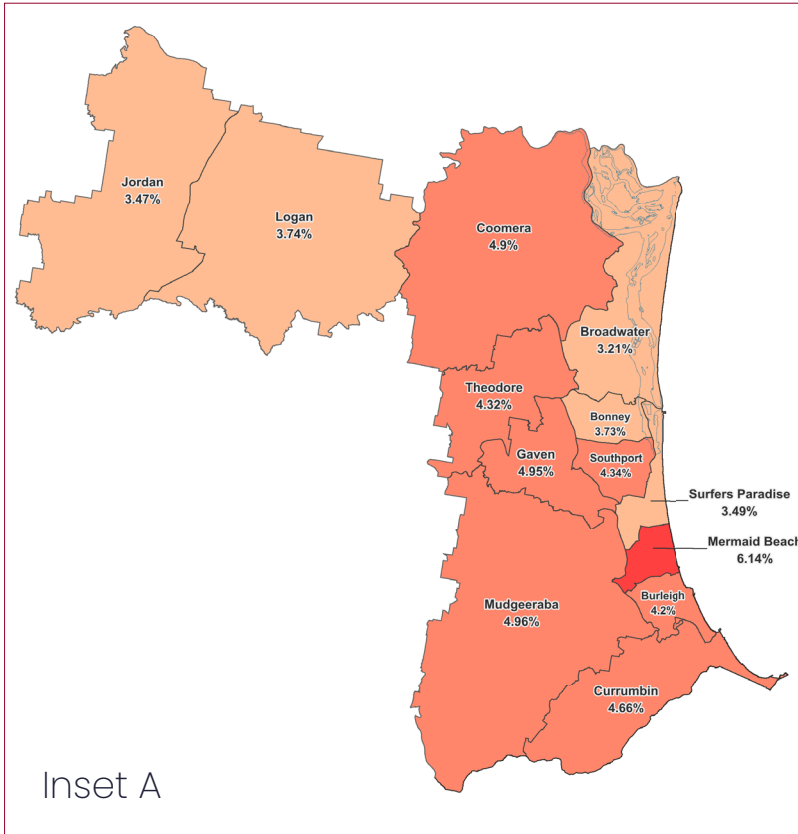
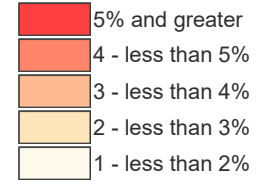

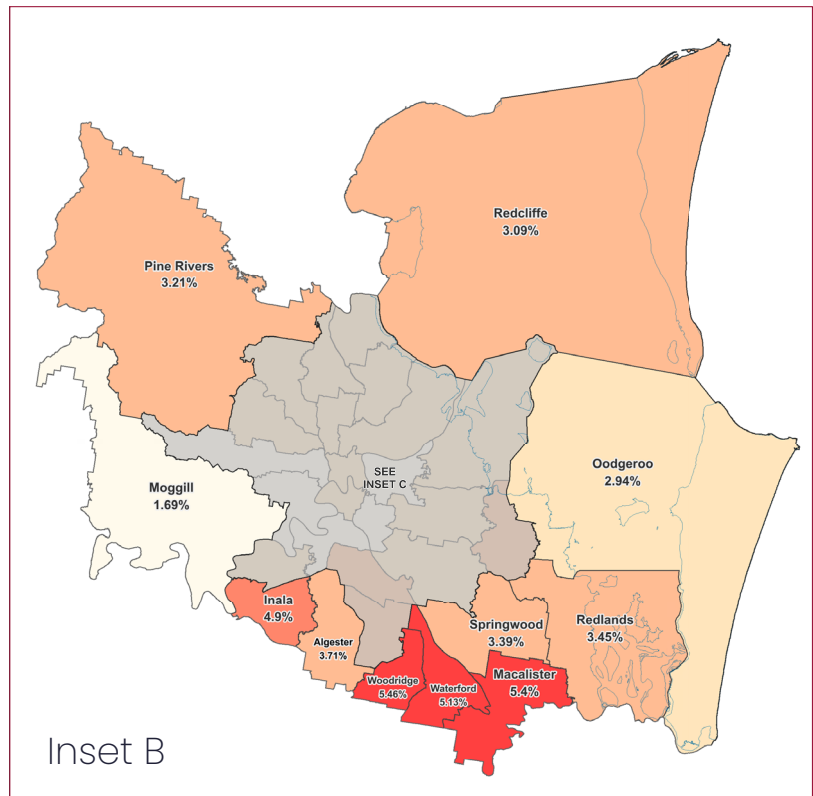
Informality by Electorate

(The number of informal ballots, as a percentage of the total number of ballots cast within an electorate)

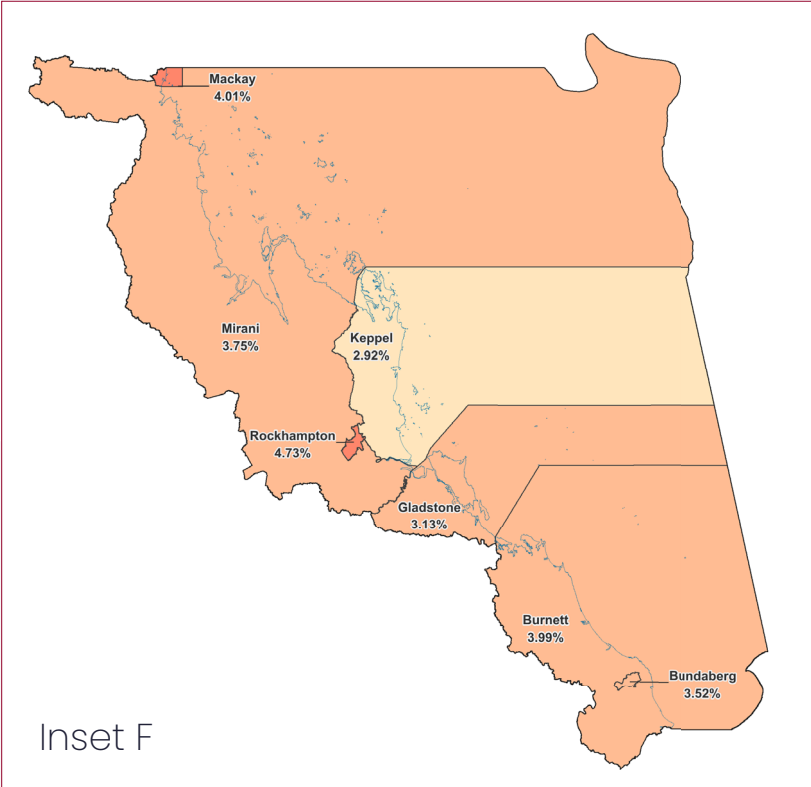




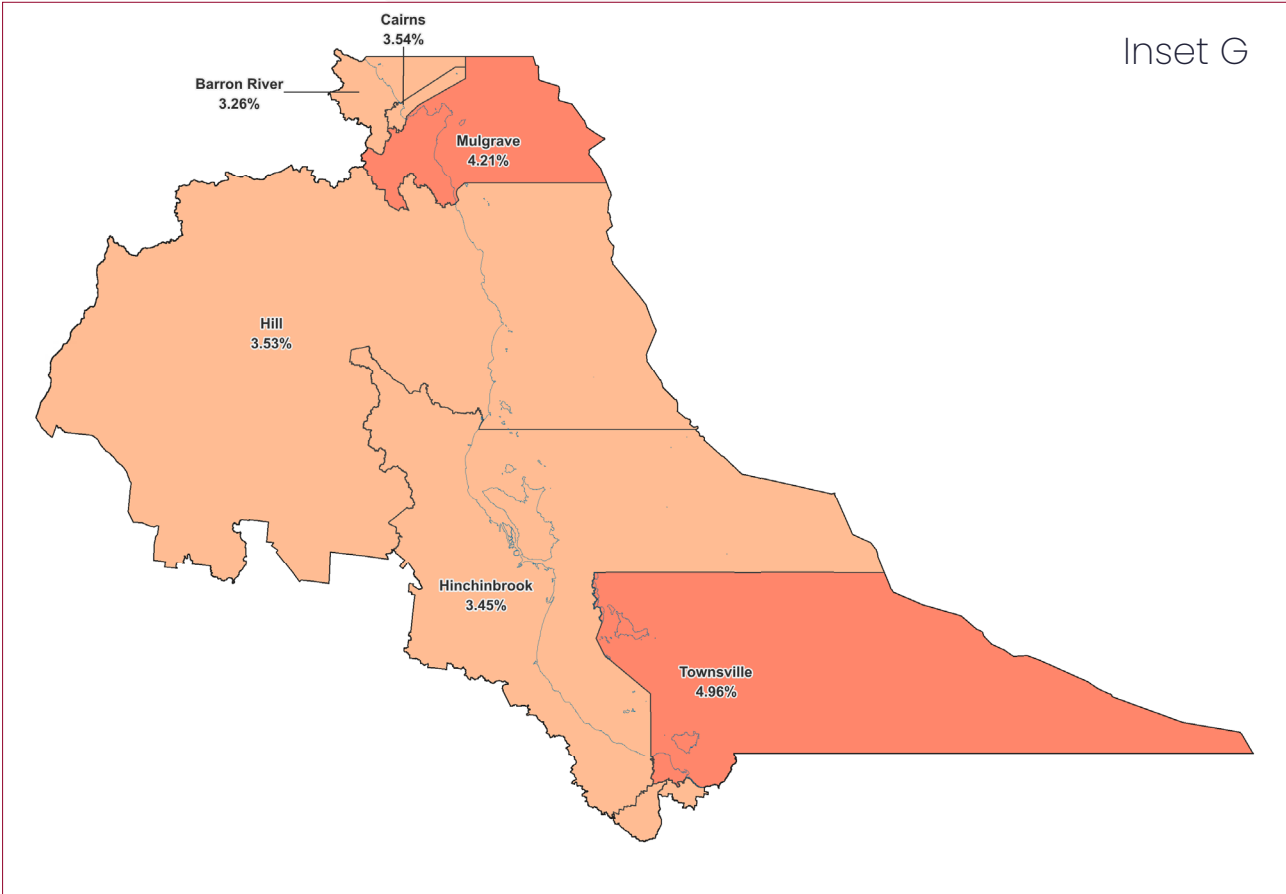

Rationale

Ordinarily, the Electoral Commission of Queensland (ECQ) conducts EVV under section 120 of the *Electoral Act 1992*. However, for the 2020 State general election, if the ECQ is satisfied that it would pose a risk to the health and safety of Issuing Officers to visit any electors for the purpose of conducting EVV it may direct Issuing Officers, under section 392R of the *Electoral Act*, not to visit a particular elector, any elector, or electors in a particular electoral district or class.

Direction

The ECQ is satisfied that it would pose a risk to the health and safety of Issuing Officers to visit any electors for the purpose of conducting EVV and directs all Issuing Officers for the 2020 State general election:

- not to visit any elector for the purpose of conducting an EVV; and
- if a request for an EVV is received, the ECQ or Returning Officer must, to the extent practicable, have an Issuing Officer make alternative arrangements to enable an elector affected by the direction to vote in the 2020 State general election.

The Electoral Commission of Queensland (ECQ) is empowered under section 392T of the *Electoral Act 1992* to give directions about the distribution or display of how-to-vote cards or other election material in the 2020 State general election.

Direction

The ECQ is satisfied that it is in the public interest to regulate, limit or prohibit the distribution or display of how-to-vote cards or other election material at a polling booth for the 2020 State general election.

This Direction applies to all persons distributing or displaying how-to-vote cards at ANY polling booth in Queensland.

Although election material and how-to-vote cards may be handed out to electors, the ECQ hereby directs that you:

- not re-use how-to-vote cards,
- abide by the current social distancing rules, including staying 1.5m away from other people (that is, by each person remaining at arms-length from each other when handing out election material or how-to-vote cards),
- maintain hygiene standards, in accordance with Queensland Health guidelines and directions,
- not shake hands, or attempt to shake hands, with electors as they are entering or waiting to enter the polling booth,
- not go near people if they are coughing or sneezing, and
- wear a face mask where possible.

ECQ staff will be actively monitoring compliance with this Direction. The Electoral Commissioner has the power to issue further directions, in the event ECQ staff observe non-compliance.

Failure to comply with this Direction carries a maximum of 10 penalty units, currently valued at \$1,334.

All existing laws and regulations regarding canvassing for votes at a polling booth continue to apply, including those relating to exclusion zones.

Effective

This Direction has immediate effect and remains in place until the close of voting for the 2020 State general election on Saturday, 31 October 2020, unless otherwise revised.

The ECQ is satisfied that it is in the public interest to regulate the movement of candidates and scrutineers at the places where they are entitled to be present under the *Electoral Act* during the 2020 State general election.

The ECQ hereby directs scrutineers and candidates:

- to abide by the current social distancing rules, including staying 1.5 metres away from other persons where possible, when performing their functions under the Act,
- where it is not possible to maintain a distance of 1.5 metres from other persons while performing functions under the Act, it is recommended face masks be worn,¹
- to maintain hygiene standards, in accordance with Queensland Health guidelines and directions, and
- to not shake hands or attempt to shake hands with persons at polling booths or at places declaration envelopes are being scrutinised and/or votes counted.

ECQ staff will be actively monitoring compliance with this Direction. The Electoral Commissioner has the power to issue further directions, in the event ECQ staff observe non-compliance.

Failure to comply with this Direction carries a maximum of 20 penalty units, currently valued at \$2,669.

All existing laws and regulations regarding canvassing for votes at a polling booth continue to apply, including those relating to exclusion zones.

Effective

This Direction has immediate effect and remains in place until the declaration of results for the 2020 State general election, unless otherwise revised.

¹ ECQ polling booth staff members will also be required to comply with these directions.

This notice identifies the classes of electors who, under section 121A of the *Electoral Act 1992* and 4AA of the *Electoral Regulation 2013*, may make an electronically assisted vote (telephone vote) at the 2020 State general election.

This notice also declares, under section 392S of the *Electoral Act*, additional classes of electors who may make a telephone vote at the 2020 State general election to reduce the risks to health due to COVID-19.

Electors who are eligible to use the telephone voting service for this election:

- electors who cannot vote without assistance due to an impairment or an insufficient level of literacy;
- electors who cannot vote at a polling booth because of an impairment;
- special postal voters who are not detained in lawful custody;
- distance voters whose enrolled address is more than 20km from a polling booth;
- electors who during the election period, are located interstate or overseas;
- electors who, during the election period, are required to quarantine or isolate, for example those diagnosed with COVID-19, because of a direction issued under sections 362B or 362H of the *Public Health Act 2005*; and
- electors who have undergone a COVID-19 test between Wednesday, 28 October and 12pm (noon) Saturday, 31 October 2020 and have been asked to quarantine or isolate until advised of the outcome of their test result.
